 to the Earth to be decently interred at the discretion of my Executors
 and further touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God
 to bless me with I will and bequeath in the following manner and form
 I give and Bequeath to my eldest son Joseph Carrowan one half of all my
 land and my desire is that he shall have that part of the land whereon
 my dwelling house now stands together with all the Benefits and
 privileges unto the said land belonging
 Item I give and Bequeath to my son Ephraim Carrowan the half of all
 my lands my desire being that he shall have the westernmost part of my
 land joining Peter Herman Patton and with all the privileges thereunto
 appertaining
