I give, I give and bequeath to my son aforesaid Harrison all my
Land, Intersment, Store, Tools and all the Rest of my Property to my
will beloved wife Ann Harrison to pay my lawfull debts and
to Raise & school my Children on and should there be any
property left at my wife's death I want it to be Equally between
my three Girls Judith Harrison Sarah Harrison & Phoebe
Harrison - my wife is not to be interrupted in the tenure and
Plantation nor any other property till her Death - I further
appoint my well Beloved wife Ann Harrison & John Chambers
Jr Executors to this my last will & testament this 5th Day of
November 1805 - Subscribed before signed word call my hand,

I give and bequeath unto John Chambers Junior one negro woman
named Rose, the Rest of my property to pay my lawfull debts only two
I give to John Chambers Jr that one Acre at David Wing's the
one Acre Abram Withins, or, and if there is any thing else it
is to be Equally Divided between - Bencher & Parthen Chambers
Also I appoint John Chambers Jr and Thomas Kinchley and William
Bailey Executors to this my last will & testament in witness
of the same I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal
this 8th Day of April 1806
