Item I give and Bequeath to my son Hosea Eborn all the Land between
my son James Eborns line down to the small Dip at the
upper part of my Plantation with the course out to the staking
three hundred acres more or less be it to him and his heirs for ever
and also give my son Hosea Eborn two negroes called George
& Cadd to him and his heirs for ever —

Item I give Bequeath to my son James Eborn two hundred acres of land
Lying in Brunswick County on each side of George Swamp and
one Cross cut can be it to him his heirs for ever —

Constitute and appoint two sons James Eborn and James Eborn
Executor to this my last will and testament Revoking all other
wills or Wills wheresoever I have here set my hand seal this
11 day January of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred
and ninety seven 1797 —

In the name of God, amen I John Morrow of Hills County and State of North Carolina
Being weak of Body but of disposing mind and memory blessed be God for it balking to mind
the more certainty of this life and being ordained once for all people to die I do
make and ordain this my instrument of writing to contain my last will and testament
in something and revoking all other wills and testaments heretofore made by me either by
word or writing and this only to be taken as my last will and testament
first that is to say I recommend my soul to Almighty God that gave it and my
body to be decently in a Christianlike manner buried in my place as it shall
please my executor here named and set work to do it both being pleased to
be buried in my grave above my dearest Wife and disposed in manner and form as
followeth the first my will and desire is that all my just debts and personal things be
first paid in convenient time after my Decease
My will and desire is that my well beloved daughter Thomas should have twenty three
acres of Land that she has already had of for her dower and joining one
Thomas Brooks and all other thing as she is already content with to her and her heirs
Lawfully begotten of her body

I do give and bequeath to my well beloved son William Morrow two hundred and
thirty acres of Land beginning at Thomas second corner a log stake & stake
standing in the place Brackets Lane then running with said Brooks line to a
beard stake in the branch from thence the corner still continued
so far as to conclude two hundred and thirty acres running to the south
as for both ends to be of an equal width to him and his heirs
I do give and bequeath to my well beloved son James two hundred and
thirty acres of Land beginning at a cedar stake in the side of the
gold Swamp being the Division between Joshua Wols and joining
with the course of the Patent along the gold Swamp against a large
Red timber pasture near the grass and running from a large
rotten bar pasture a course to the bay or hollow as will conclude
two hundred and thirty acres and giving to William to him and his heirs
and likewise I give and bequeath to my well beloved son David two hundred
and thirty acres of Land beginning at James second corner
and running with the Patent as far as will conclude two hundred
and thirty acres running the course of Patent joining on
James side to conclude two hundred & thirty acres to him and his heirs
and likewise I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Ruth fifty
acres of Land joining of Davids to her and hers
Likewise I give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Charity

fifty acres of Land joining of Bethinsh toward here here
 I likewise give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Sarah fifty
 acres of Land joining of Charity and running with the corner
 of the pasture at the south end of my Land & likewise I give
 to my two sons Jeremiah and David a Cow and Calfe a pair,
 I likewise give to my three sons William Jeremiah and David
 Browns Island for a privilege to them and heirs my Land in
 Pasquotank and my Slop and notes and books debt, the said Land
 Slop sold and what they fetch and my notes and Books debts
 collected forth pay my debts and likewise my negro to be
 hired out yearly for the support of all my children and to
 give them Learning and when David comes to age they shall
 them and there increase for to be Equally divided among
 my stock and household furniture to be Equally divided between
 my three daughters Betheir Charity and Sarah their
 and labor constitute and appoint my friend and living son
 Thomas Parson and William Parson my sole and sole executor to the
 my last will and testament to settle all Business according to
 this my last will and testament and the Law shall require as
 witness my hand and seal this second Day of June one
 thousand seven hundred ninety one and fiftenth year of
 American Independence

 Hyde County Very sick and weak in body but of sound
 mind and memory thanks be to God for the same but calling to mind the
 uncertainty of Death and knowing that both of us shall once for all men to
 die therefore I desire to make this my last will and testament principally
 fully and first of all I recommend my body to the Lord from Whom
 it came and to be buried at the discretion of my Executors to be Buried in
 a Christian like manner likewise I recommend my soul to the hands of God
 who give it Nothing Doubting but receive the same again at the general
 resurrection the mighty power of God and attaching such worldly
 goods or estate that it hath Pleaseth God to bestow on me with in this life I give and
 Dispose of the same in following manner and form

Item I give and bequeath unto my wife Martha Wright all my Land and Plantation
 Wheron I now live during her natural life but after her death my will
 and desire so that my son William Wright should inherit the same
 when and his heirs forever likewise I send all my household goods
 and my stock of Cattle or of any kind to be used during her natural
 life or widowhood and then to be Equally divided between my children

Item I give and bequeath unto son Thomas Wright one hundred acres of Land
 lying up part of my own

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Wright one feather
 bed and furniture with one Cow and Lamb to her and her heirs forever
 and further I appoint my will beloved son William Wright and James
 Wright my executors of this my last will and testament Keeping all
 will or will to be for made by me only acknowledging this to be my last
 will and testament In writing witness where of I have hereunto set
 my hand and seal this thirteenth day of October in the year of our Lord
 one thousand seven hundred and ninety five
