First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife one bed and furniture to choose one box & coffee box choice and that her choice one pot & looks like choice one Lovers and all the gear belonging to me & dinner plate and her choice of the wedding sheet one Disk and base on her choice one Camer cupboard and the necessary's belonging to it half a dozen Earthen plates one tray & silver five chair four of them small one elbow chair one small box one tea kettle Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah one Luster three Peter plates.

Item I give and bequeath to my son James Harbert one bed and furniture one Chest one Peter Dish and base on four Peter plates one box & bust one base and bottles half my shoe tools one small trunk one tray one pot one gun —

Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Harbert one bed and furniture one tea and coffee base one Disk & base on four Peter plates one pot half my shoe tools

Also my will and desire is that all and singular the rest of my property may be sold to pay my debts and if there should be anything over to be equally divided among them and I hereby make and appoint and ordain my beloved wife Sarah Harbert Executrix of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I the said Ignatius Harbert have written my last will and testament this my hand & seal this twenty ninth day of February one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight.

In the Name of God Amen I Ignatius July of the County of Hyde being weak and soon but of perfect sound mind memory thinks he to almighty God for it calling to mind the mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed for all men to die I do make ordaine constitute and appoint this to be my last will & testament revoking do sumthing all other wills & wills by me made before manner following viz,

First I give unto my son Anthony July fifty acres of land lying on Mollamarket lake being the Southernmost part of the conveyance from James Clayton to Morris Jones

Secondly I give unto my son James July the other fifty acres joining Anthony's it being the Northernmost part of the said land to him and his heirs for ever —

Thirdly I bind unto my wife Elizabeth July all the remainder part of my land that I have or shall have during her natural life —

Fourthly I give unto my beloved wife one feather bed and the furniture belonging to it Fifthly I give unto my son Anthony July one feather bed and furniture belonging to it after the decease of my wife Elizabeth July —

Sixthly I give unto my son James July one feather bed and furniture belonging to it after my wife Elizabeth July decease —

Seventhly I bind unto my wife Elizabeth July During her natural life and no longer one negro fellow named Samuel and then I will and bequeath aforesaid the said negro fellow Samuel to my son James July —

Eighthly I bind unto my wife Elizabeth July all my cattle they may then increase During her natural life and no continued on next page
