and my Mill is that they shall not hinder each other from cutting
Rail Timber firewood and such like on each of their parts
and if one inclines to sell he shall give the Preference to the
other and also that my wife Roxanna Cox shall have full
privileges on this said Lands during her life

I Give to my son David Cox my Gun Shoemakers tools and
Tools and Mill stones.

I Give to my daughter Elizabeth Cox one feather bed & chamber

Item

I Give to my Grandson Joseph Kitterlin one Goo Lamb

Item

I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Kitterlin one Shilling

Item

I Give to my Daughter Tabitha Harvey one Shilling

Item

I Give to my Daughter Charity Cox one Shilling

Item

I Give to my Daughter Mary Cox one Shilling

Item

I Give to my Daughter Anne Cox one Shilling

Item

I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Cox one Shilling

Item

The Remaining Part of my Estate that I have not mentioned

I do Give & Bequeath to my well Beloved wife Roxanna Cox to sell Nine
or Dispose of in what manner she Please And I do hereby appoint
Roxanna Cox & Mary Chambers my soul Executrix to this my
Last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this twenty day of August Anno Domini Eighteen
hundred and Seventy two

Williams living in Kinston in my County of Hyde Being sick and dying
in body But of perfect mind & memory makes his will unto God Almighty
God and calling to Remembrance the uncertain Estate of his life
and knowing that all flesh must yield unto death I then
do please God to call me make Constituted ordain & declare this
my Last Will & Testament and none other and no part thereof
off my Imprive Estate and such good Cloths and Dishes
as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me I do order give
and dispose of same in manner & form following of which effects
will that all those debts & dues as I owe in justice to any person whatever
shall truly be paid and Contented by my Executors here
after named I Promiseth

I give unto my daughter Anna one Shilling Sterlingo
I give unto my daughter Nancy one Shilling Sterlingo

I give unto my daughter Anna one Shilling Sterlingo
I give unto my daughter Lucy Shilling Sterlingo

I give and Bequeath unto my Son Hopkins Williams the
Plantation and fifty acres of Land wheron he now
dwells & likewise half of my patty acre to him & his heirs

I Give & Bequeath unto my Son William fifty acres of Land
which is joining to Hopkins & acres and half of my
patty acre

I give unto my daughter Elizabeth one house built to her
and her heirs

I give unto my wife Elizabeth Williams all my lands
over even
