

I make all now by these presents that I Jacob Tooley of Hyde County in the Province of North Carolina planter in Consideration of the Natural Laws and affection I have Bearg You my wife Catharine Tooley as also for her Better Maintenance have do hereby Lived unto my said Wife Catharine During her Natural Life the Following Goods and Chattels to Will One Negro woman Phillis one D<sup>r</sup> Penny one bed & furniture  
Truly head of cattle marked an iron bit in the Right ear and a Crop stell D<sup>r</sup> Irons bit in the left one chest one  
Can on Table four chairs two Pots one pot Island two dishes  
three Basins and of the Death of my wife Ann I give  
Grant and Caupism the aforesaid Goods enumerated & items  
but my son Jacob Tooley Junr & his heirs & assigns forever  
provided upon the less that the above articles are deemed to  
Stand the property of the said Jacob Tooley until his Death  
this Instrument of Conveyance & not to oppose or be in  
any way against to the true intent & Meaning thereof  
In witness whereof the said Jacob Tooley has hereunto set  
my hand & seal this 5<sup>th</sup> Day of June Anno Domini 1771

In the Name of God & men the Thirtieth first of April 1771  
I Livi Merdick Being sick and weak in Body but of perfect  
Mind and Memory thankes be to god and Calling to Mind  
the Mortality of my Body and knowyng that it is Appointed  
for all men once to die do make and Ordaine this my last  
Will and Testament First of all I Give and Recommend my sole to  
the hands of God that Guard it and my Body I Recommend to the  
Earth to be Buried in a Desent Christian Burial at the Discretion  
of my Executor & Nothing Daunting but at the General Resurrection  
I Reiuue the same againe by the Mighty favorre and Glory  
of God and as touch such Mortall Estate as it hath pleased God  
to Bless me in this life I make and Ordaine this my Last Will  
Testament and shall Disposse of the same in the following Manner  
and Forme — Hauing given my will Beloued Brother Benjamin  
Murdick Two hundred acres of Land called Stiles Neck and One  
hundred acres on Moose Harbor and One Silver Steele Bucket  
Hauing to my Beloued Bridgit Murdick one Yer old Heifer  
and all the David Bacons that I haue and one Woollye Whale and  
an dozen of Kivers & forks and one pair of fire tongues land shooel  
and one pair of hand Bellows and one Potish Dish and two  
pasta Basons and one Iron Pot and one pair of Pot Hooks and  
one Iron Skillet and one pair of pot Handles and a pair of  
Spatulas and boy and all the Eatting Ware that I haue and two  
Dinners Glass and all my he ggs I haue and all my Nails  
Horn and one Iron Potter and one pair of Silver Shovell Buckets  
and all the Rest of my Eatting and two axes and one hoe and  
all my Lemming I haue and all the Cotton and Flax I haue  
Hau I Give to my deare Michel Murdick one Ear & Eye  
Hau Give to my Lichoh Murdick one Ear and Earling and one  
pair of Silver Buttons — My Land in Testel Neck I leave  
to be sold to pay my lawfull Debts and my Cows and Horse and  
plow and herer Gair.  
Hau I Give to John Murdick all my wearring Cloath  
Hau and all this is left of by my Debts is paid to School Bridget  
Murdick the Children — My Will is that my fauorite and Beloued Boy  
aniel Murdick shall be my Executor of this my Last Will and Testament  
In witness whereof I haue set my seal and Seigel ney  
this day & year above written — Livi Murdick

North Carolina Hyde County of & In the name of God Amen I William Harris  
of the County of Hyde and Freeman of North Carolina of sound & Calling  
into mind the Mortality of my Body and Knowing that it is opportune  
for all men ever to die. I make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament,  
that is to say, Imprimis to my dear Children that live in this England,  
viz., William Harris and Mary Backhouse, and Elizabeth Jackson. I give  
to each of them Shilling Sterling a piece to be paid to them by my Executor,  
if Required, Then I give and Bequeath to my Son Peter Harris On Shilling  
Sterling to be paid to him by my Executor if Required, Then I give  
and Bequeath to my Son John Morris Two hundred and Thirty acres  
of Land it being the South Easter side of my Land & bordering on the  
Head of Jacks Creek Frederick Bostwick Land to the Eastward  
& South & Northward on Land I gave to my Son Peter Harris, I also give  
to my Son John Harris, a Negro man named Caesar, then all  
Remainder of my Estate, real and personal I give to my four Daughters,  
viz., Amy, Lucretia, & Rebecca & Mary, as heirs of the District. Then  
I give and Bequeath to Daughter Amy Whifield a hundred and Thirty  
acres of Land it being the most Northward side of my Land and  
bordering on a river called the Hammonock Creek, then running up the said  
Creek, 18 A to the southward joining on Henry Edwards Land. I give  
also to my Daughter Amy Whifield a quarter part of my cattle, & one Negro  
Boy named Sam the said Boys I give to her & her heirs of her Body  
forever, Then I give to my Daughter Mary Harris Two hundred and Thirty  
Eight acres of Land joining to the Land I gave to my Daughter Amy  
Whifield on the Northward side & running to the Northward to the  
Eastward on Jacks Creek & Land I give my Daughter Lucretia, together  
with all the improvements thereon, as Horses Cattle Garden fruits &c - with  
one third part of all my movable Estate as Cattle Horses Hogs Sheep and  
Household Goods &c with one Negro Girl named Silla & her son a  
to her my Daughter Mary & the Heirs of her Body lawfully Begotten  
on her Body forever, Then I give to my Daughter Lucretia Harris Two hun-  
dred & Thirty Eight acres of Land joining to the Northward, On the Land  
I give to my Daughter Mary Northward on Jacks Creek & Eastward  
on the Land I give to my Daughter Rebecca, Southward as far as my Land  
Runs with one third part of all my Movable Estate, as Cattle Horses Hogs  
Sheep & Household Goods &c with one Negro Girl named Silla, which said  
Negro & give to my Daughter Lucretia & the heirs of her Body lawfully Beg-  
otten on her Body forever, Then I give to my Daughter Rebecca Harris Two  
hundred & Thirty Eight acres of Land joining to the Northward on Land I give to  
my Daughter Lucretia to the Northward on Jacks Creek & to the Eastward one  
Land I give to my Son John Harris & Southward as far as my Land runs  
with one third part of all my Movable Estate, as Cattle Horses Hogs  
Sheep & Household Goods and one Negro Girl named Eliza, which said  
Negro Girl I give to my Daughter Rebecca with her son to her my  
Daughter Rebecca and to the heirs of her Body lawfully Begotten on her  
Body forever, and my Will is, that if either of these my four daughters,  
Should die, without an lawful heir then and in such case that what is  
given her in this Will may be Equally Divided amongst the said  
surviving Sisters, Then I send to Sarah my well Beloved Wife, During  
her widowhood her living in my Dwelling House on my plantation  
with the use of all the opportunity thereunto belonging and four  
Negro Work, viz., one Cow, Sled & Buffe During her said widowhood, and  
after her Return in Equal Share, to be Equally Divided among my four  
Daughters viz., Amy, Lucretia, & Rebecca, & Mary, & I also hereby give  
order to all the negro fellow named Sam for the sum of one hundred  
and twenty five dollars proclamation money, to any body, that will advance  
that sum for him, I also hereby give orders to my Executors
