In the name of God Amen I Major Clark of Hyde County State of
 North Carolina Planter &c. being of perfect and sound mind and
 memory but calling to mind the Mortality of Death Uncertainty of Death
 and knowing that it is appointed for all men to Die I do therefore
 make this my last will and Testament Revoking all other wills by me
 made &c. and freely & Principally I Recommend my Soul into the
 Hands of God that Give it me Nothing doubting but at the General
 Resurrection to receive the same again by the mighty Power of God
 and my body I Recommend to the Earth to be Buried at the direction
 of my Executors hereafter mentioned and as to what worldly Estate
 it hath Pleased God to bestow upon me in this life I give
 demise and Bequeath in manner and form following
 In primis I Give and Bequeath unto my son William Clark three
 Hundred Acres of Land the Eastward End of Buck Ridge to him
 and his Heirs for Ever also a Tract or Parcel of Land lying on
 the West side of Bath Town Creek to him and his Heirs for Ever
 I also Give unto my son William Clark four Negroes namely
 Pompey Jack Jake & Bet to him and his Heirs for Ever also I
 Give unto my son William Clark one feather Bed and furniture
 I Give unto my son Henry Clark three Hundred Acres of Land it
 being part of the Tract of Land whereon I now live to him and his
 Heirs for Ever I also Give unto my son Henry Clark one Tract
 or parcel of Land lying on the So side of Pamphlet River on
 the South side of Goose Creek to him and his Heirs for Ever
 I also Give unto my son Henry Clark a Tract or Parcel of
 Land South side of Pamphlet River on Campbells Creek containing
 two Hundred Acres to him and his Heirs for Ever
 I Give unto my son Henry Clark George, Meriah, Sutton and
 dook to him and his Heirs for Ever I also Give to my son Henry
 one feather Bed and furniture
 I Give unto my son Samuel Clark four Hundred acres of Land it being
 my Manor Plantation whereon I now live &c. to him and his Heirs for Ever
 I also Give unto my said son Samuel Clark two Hundred acres of
 Buck Ridge at their West End to him and his Heirs for Ever
 I also Give unto my son Samuel Clark four Negroes Simon
 Frank Isaac and Diner to him and his Heirs for Ever
 I like wise Give unto my son Samuel one feather Bed
 Continued on other side

and furniture.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Probable
five negroes namely Jude Prince Tom also the young child the
said Jude now has to her and her heirs for Ever.

Item I Give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Satchell five
negroes namely Ben Stephen Willis Isaac and Rose to her
and her heirs for Ever.

Item I Give unto my Daughter Mary Burrow one negro woman named Sal one negro
Yellow named Sam to her and her heirs for Ever.

Item I Bind unto my Beloved wife Mary Clark one third part of my manner
Plantation one third part of all my stock of horses cattle sheep hogs &c.
During her life after her decease to be Equally divided between the six
Children before mentioned in my will Excepting the Land before given
to my son Sam. Clark also Excepting the two negroes pille and Samuel
That I Bind unto my said wife two negroes during her natural life, Samuel
and Phillis I Give unto my well Beloved Wife Mary Clark one Negro Girl named
Sephie her own for four use for ever also one Bed and furniture to have her choice &c.

Item after my said wife's Decease I Give the afore said two negroes Samuel and Phillis
unto my Daughter Mary Burrow to her and her heirs for Ever.

Lastly I Constitute Nominate and appoint my two sons William and Henry
Clark also my son in law John Satchell Executors to this my last will and
Testament Revoking all other Wills by me made allowing this only to be my
last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this Eighteenth of February 1786.

In the Name of God Amen, I Mary Hucery of the County of Hyde
in the State of North Carolina Widow, Being of sound Perfect mind and
Memory Blessed God do hereby woid and Revoke all former Wills and
Testaments I have made at any times and declare make ordain and
Publish this to be my last will and Testament in the following
Manner Imperishable I Give and Bequeath my soul into the Hands
of God Almighty God my exalted Breaching his most gracious
Acceptance and Mercy Requiescat that my Body shall have a decent
Burial without Pomp or any Extravagance to the Discretion of my
Executor, I will and Positively order that my Piece of Land over the
Bay shall be sold first to the Best advantage and my Debt to be
paid immediately out of the net Proceeds of the said Land and
the remaining Part if there is any to be Equally Divided between
my two Children Thomas Hucery and Winford Hucery.

Item I Lent unto my well Beloved Daughter Winford Hucery aforesaid
for the term of her present widow hood only my negro man the
name of Emoe with out Charges to any Party if my said Daughter
Gits married or Dies in one of these Cases been happen. I Give
Leave Give and Bequeath after my Daughter marries or Dies
unto my son Thomas Hucery and his heirs for ever the said
negro named Emoe. I Leave and Bequeath for ever unto
my aforesaid Daughter unto her and her heirs for ever my negro
woman the name of Nan one Cow and calf and one Heffer
one Stear one Sow with her Piggs at her choice amongst
my cattle and Hoggs I also Give and Bequeath unto her
my Befat and what ever Belongs to it also one half of the
remaining Part of my Hoggs and sheep also one half of
the marts barn and wheat gathered or to be gathered my
cloths and blows made or to be made my Bed or and all
belonging to them what ever Effects House furniture
& other things or articles shall Remain to my Estate after
my Death Reserving for my son Thomas Hucery what ever
Must to him in the following I leave if the Effects remains
to my Estate after my Death I leave to him my negro
Emoe as above mentioned Intestate.
