

State of North Carolina Hyde County September 17th 1802—
 In the name of God I Nathan Harvey planter of the same
 County & state aforesaid being sick but of a perfect sound
 mind & of disposing memory calling to mind the mortality
 of man and the frailty of my body knowing that it is ap-
 pointed once for all men to die Do make and ordain this
 my Last will and testament Ever Revoking & annulling
 any other will or wills by me before made and as for my
 soul that I recommend into the hands of God who gave it
 me and my Body I Recommend to the ground to be buried
 in a Christian like manner at the Discretion of my
 executors who I shall hereafter mention and as touching
 such worldly goods or estate as it hath been please God
 bless me with in this life I give and Dispose of them
 in the following manner

Item I give and Bequeath to my two sons Nathan Harvey
 Wammewell all my Land to be equally divided
 between the two and If either of them should Die with-
 out a Law full heir begetting his body it is all to
 belong to the surviving son only I except my wife's lifetime
 or widowhood in the house & plantation to have the use
 of the same without Interruption

Item, Then I give and Bequeath unto my four children one
 Breasting Cow a piece

Item, then I give and Bequeath unto my two sons my two girls
 and clear my boy more for the use of my wife's children
 and if she should breed I want my son Nathan to have
 the first Colt & if she should bring any more Colts I want
 my other children to have them, and if my wife be
 with Child I desire it should come in for an equal
 part of the movable property and the residue of my property
 I leave for the use of my wife & children to support and
 be schooled out of and to pay my debts and if there
 should be anything left when the children is raised
 I want it equally divided between the four children
 also I appoint my wife and my son Nathan and
 Charles Hudson Executors to this my Last will and

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do solemn Witness my hand & seal this 17th Sept 1802—

 aforesaid Being Very sick and weak in body but in perfect
 mind and memory thanks be to God for the same calling
 unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is
 appointed for all men once to die Do make and ordain this
 my Last will and testament That is to say first of all I
 give and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty
 God and my body to be buried in a decent manner at the
 Discretion of my Executors nothing Doubting but I shall
 Receive the same by the hand of almighty God, as touching
 such worldly Estate as it hath been please God to bless
 me with in this life I give and Dispose of in the following
 manner and form
 First I give and bequeath The manner plantation where I
 now live on to my Beloved wife Junisha Riving during her
 natural life and no longer after her Death to my son
 Jasper John Jasper Rive to him and his heirs for ever
 Secondly I give and Bequeath to my wife Junisha Rive an
 year of corn and bark during her natural life and no longer
 Thirdly I give to my wife Junisha Rive an negro woman
 by the name of Hannah her three daughters During her natural
 life after her Death to my Daughter Esparney to her and her
 heirs for ever Fourthly I give and Bequeath to my wife
 Junisha Rive a tract of land together with all the furniture
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
