Harris and Ebenezer Butch Exrs of this my last will & testament. I do disavow all former wills, legacies &c. by me made ratifying and confirming this and nothing to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day & year above written. In the name of God Amen, I Nathaniel Hyde County of Spencer one of the State and County of said being before of bodily and sound mind & disposing memory do make and ordain this my last will & testament in manner and form as follows Viz^d 1st I give and bequeath unto my son William Spencer that part of my land lying to the east of a Ditch leading into Messisquit Creek to the west end of the bridge running southwesterly to Christopher Spencer line with said 3rd I give unto my son Nathan Spencer all my land to the west of the above said ditch described in the first Legacy to the Indian Line. 3rd I give unto my daughter Jenny Spencer one bed and furniture one cow and calf one wheel and one pot. 4th I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Spencer one bed and furniture one cow and calf one wheel and one pot. 5th I give unto my daughter the Morning Spencer one bed & furniture & one cow & calf one wheel and one pot. 6th I give unto my daughter Marguerite & Mary one negro woman named Lucy 7th I give unto my daughter Ruth and Jenny one negro woman named Sarah 8th I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Spencer one negro girl named Mahaly. 9th I give unto my daughter Morning Spencer one negro girl named Judith. 10th I give unto my four sons William, Nathan, Richard and Benjamin one negro boy named Sam to work with them year about until they come off to a Division by sale but not to be sold out of the family. 11th I give unto my daughter Sarah Harris one hundred Dollars to be raised out of my property not all ready given a way after the death of my wife. 12th It is my desire that all the Rest of my property not all ready disposed of should after the death of my wife should be equally divided between my children when and where a like 13th It is my desire that the Legacies Third fourth and fifth should be given to my daughters by my Executors immediately after my death. 14th That Nathaniel Hyde unto my beloved wife all my property Real and personally hereat the fore Legacies Third fourth and fifth during her natural life Then Dispose of by my Executors as directed before in this instrument. I do hereby now make and appoint my sons William and Nathaniel Spencer my Executors of this my

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Last will Revoking all others by me or former made

sister Mary Davis five hundred dollars in Cash to be paid
by my Executors and my will is for her to have the use of one
of my negro fellows during her widowhood and no longer
to have her choice of them. I give my said sister one horse
saddle and bridle to her and her heirs forever. I give my
nephew Benjamin Davis my watch to him & his heirs forever
I give to Lois Davis Elizabeth Davis, Polly Davis and Benj. Davis
all my negroes to be equally divided them and their heirs forever
I shall my notes and I will in same manner to them and
their heirs forever all the residue of my Estate be equally
divided between Lois, Elizabeth, Polly and Benjamin Davis
to them and their heirs. I nominate and appoint my sister
Mary Davis Executrix and her heirs till they arrive to the
age that the law directs or will entitle them to receive it In
case my sister should in any way will is that then the Court
appoint a guardian In witness whereof I have set my hand and
seal, this 5th January 1819.

importance for all men and to do make and ordain this my last will
and testament in manner and form following Viz. first I recommend my soul into the
hands of God who gave it and my body to be buried in a
Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors
and what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bless me
with I give and devise in the form and manner following
first I lend unto my beloved wife Louisa the land and
plantation whereon I now live for and during her natural
life I also give her my negro woman Thial to her and to
her heirs forever. I also give her five hundred dollars readily
I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Gibbs fifty
acres and 1/2 of acres of land that I bot of Aaron Gibbs joining
Grace Taylor at Mysocken I also give my negro boy Ross and
my negro girl Thuy to her and her heirs forever. I give
to my son Rodd and Gibbs one hundred and seventy five
acres of land at Middlebury joining Benjamin Gibbs and
Alexander Caburn fifty acres on the north side of the lake
joining John Selby and also my negro man and his heirs
and the negro woman I bot of Wm. Gibbs to be sold by my Executors
for his benefit to him and his heirs forever. I give and
bequeath unto the Child my wife is now pregnant with the
land and plantation whereon I now live after the death of
my wife I also give it my negro woman Isaac to it and his heirs forever.
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
