the one my wife is now pregnant with one negro man named Frank
one negro boy named Sam, one negro boy named Bob one
negro Boy named Isaac, one Boy named Harrison, one
negro girl named Eda to be Equally divided between them
I give unto my son Landon one negro girl named Mary
at and at the Death of his Mother the Land and Plantation whereon
I now live with all the adjoining Lands belonging to me
I give unto my five children, viz. Polly, James, John, Oliver and
the one my wife is pregnant with at the Death of my wife
the negro woman sent to her by the name of Love to be together
with her In or case Equally divided between them all my
household property stock and the Residue of my estate of
Every Description I give to be Equally divided between my
wife and all my children including the one my wife now
bears that is to say she one share and each of my children
Respectively one share. I hereby Request and authorize my
Executors hereafter named to execute a deed of conveyance
to Isaac Latham for one half of the Land Purchased by me
of David Henry to be laid off adjoining the said Latham
whereby minimize and appraise Christopher Wallison
and Henry Selby Executors of this my last will testament

will and testament. I give to Ruben Rose Junior one half
of the Land whereon I now live including the plantation whereon
said Rose lives, to him and his heirs forever. I give the other half of
said Land I give to Beverly Rose to him and his heirs forever. I
give to Frederick Rose Junior my negro woman by the name of
Betsey to him and his heirs forever. I give to Marguis and
John Rose my negro woman to have by the name of Hannah
to them and their heirs forever. I give, all my household &
Kitchen Furniture I leave to be Equally divided
between Ruben Rose Junior & Frederick Rose Junior & Beverly
Rose to them and their heirs forever. Also all my stock of Cattle
and all other Things both within Doors and without be Equally
divided between Ruben Rose Junior & Frederick Rose Junior
& Beverly Rose to them and their heirs forever. I hereby
ordain and appoint my Brother Frederick Rose Junior
Executor to this my last will and testament discharging
all other wills heretofore made by me acknowledging
this to be my last will and no other. In witness whereof
