 One Looking Glass as a Bar against any other part of my Estate  
 to her and her heirs forever, —  
 Next I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Horsey,  
 One Bed and furniture as a Bar against any other part of my  
 Estate to her and her heirs forever, —  
 Next I give and Bequeath unto my Son Peter Horsey One  
 Working Hair and one Chest, as a Bar against any other  
 part of my Estate to him and his heirs forever, —  
 Next I give and Bequeath unto my well Beloved son  
 Jermom Horsey all my Real and Personal Estate which may be  
 left after the before mentioned Legacy is paid off being such  
 as my Land Tenements Household furniture all Hogs Cattle and  
 other Individual things as things that I am now possessed of  
 Excepting such articles as before mentioned to him the said Jermom  
 Horsey and his heirs forever, And I do hereby Revocable and dissolved  
 all Will or Wills by me made before the Date of these presents  
 also I do hereby appoint and charge my said son Jermom  
 Horsey wholly and solely Exor to the my last Will and  
 Testament, Signed sealed, and pronounced by me this 24<sup>th</sup>  
 Day of February and in the 7<sup>th</sup> Year of Our Kings Anno  
 Domini 1867. —

No Carolina - In the Name of God Amen Twentyeth  
 day December 1769, Am Edson of Pontagee Hill and  
 County of Hyde and Province of Carolina being very sick  
 and weak in Body but of perfect Mind and Memory  
 Thanks be unto God for it Calling to Mind that all persons erect  
 must die. I make and order this my last Will and Testament  
 I give and Recommend my soul unto hands of God that gave it  
 and my Body I Recommend to the Earth to be decently Buried at  
 the Discretion of my Friends Edward Mc Train whom I do constitute  
 and ordain to be my Exorator during but at the General  
 Resurrection I shall Rise up some a give and as Touching  
 such worldly Estate whomever it hath pleased God to Bless  
 me with in this Life I give Devise and Dispose of the same  
 in the following Manner and form, —  
 Next I give and Bequeath my funeral Charges to be paid.  
 Next I give and Bequeath to Liza Slade One Quilt paid there I  
 give Liza's Fort give One Quilt - Next I Give Mother's Taylor  
 One Shyrt Boston brand and one pair of Linen Goggles I give dozens  
 Bell One Black brand I give and Bequeath to my son William  
 Edson all the Remains of my Estate that is not mentioned  
 within does and without, I do hereby utterly Disallow Revoke  
 and Dissolve all and every other Will and Confessing this my  
 Last Will and Testament,  
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal  
 the day and Year above written.
