

In the Name of God Amen I James Webster of Hyde County in the State of North Carolina being weak of body but of sound mind & memory blessed by God for it I therefore make this my last will and testament It is my will that my body should be buried a long side & near my father at Woodstock thereby make and appoint my Beloved wife Margaret Webster my sole Executrix of this my last will and testament I then Give and Bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret Webster the Plantation Iron Dwell on and all the Land that I gave by Deeds Patents or Grants on the S. W. Side of Jordan Creek together with all improvements thereunto belonging and all my house hold Furniture also our Negro or slaves by the name of Iscor our old fellow by the name of Peter also our Negro Girl by the name of Feltie and all my stock of Different kinds Cattle sheep hogs horses and all my Plantation tools of Different kinds In testimony whereof I do affix my hand & seal this fifteenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety four

In the name of God Amen I Robert Gibbs of the State of North Carolina and County of Hyde being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following That is to say, I Give and Recommend my soul into the hands of all mighty God who gave me & my body I recommend to the Earth to be decently Buried at the discretion of my executor and attending such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I will and bequeath it in the manner & form following

Item, I Give to my beloved wife Elizabeth Gibbs one negro woman by the name of Milley one bed & furniture two cows & Calves & also the Plantation whereon I now Live during her natural life

Item, I Give and bequeath to my daughter Fiedah Gibbs one negro woman by the name of Sam one bed & furniture two cows & Calves and also fifty acres of Land more or less Lying on the Eastmost side of the main Road Beginning on the road at the east Corner of my Plantation running with said road & Dick White it strikes Stephen Hatcher line & then with the different corner of said Hatcher line around until it comes to the creek at his Eastmost corner from thence with the windings of the creek to the mouth of the gut and up the said gut to the head thereof from thence up Benjamin Sanders line leading ditch until it strikes his corner & from the corner a straight corner to the first station

Item, I Give and bequeath to my daughter Lurannah Gibbs one negro girl named Ector one bed & furniture two cows & Calves

Item I Give and bequeath to my daughter Susanna Gibbs one negro boy named Jacob one father bed & furniture two cows & Calves

Item I Give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Gibbs one negro girl named Jan my one father bed & furniture two cows & Calves

Item I Give and bequeath unto my three youngest daughters Susanah Gibbs Lurannah Gibbs & Nancy Gibbs all my tract of Land lying to the westward of the road & joining Thomas Gibbs Jr. line and Peter Spencers line to be Equally divided between them only Reserving the life time of my wife in the

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manner plantation only and also my will and desire is that the remaining part of my land and property should be sold as much as will pay my debts & should there be anything remaining to be Equally divided between my four children, Julia Gibbs, Sarah Gibbs, Hannah Gibbs & Nancy Gibbs and also my desire is provided there should be enough to satisfy my debts without that January and Sister shall be equally divided between my wife & four children and lastly I do constitute and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Gibbs Benjamin Sanders & Thomas Gibbs my sole Executors to this my last will & testament and I hereby do disavow make and Decant all other wills & Testaments by me many wise made ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & fixed my seal this 4th day of December one thousand eight hundred -

In the name of God Amen, I George Barrow of Hyde County in the state of North Carolina having my present senses & memory do make my last will and testament in writing -

I give devise & bequeath to my son William Barrow the plantation whereon I now live and the land adjoining as far down the Creek as the branch at the lower end of my plantation that leads to the main Road where there is a small arch a cross road from thence a south seventy west course through my land to the backline in the presence that parts my land from Bugar Barrows Land to him & his heirs and assigns for ever -

I then the Rest and Remainder of my land adjoining the above land and lying on pinto Creek and adjoining my friend father's land back in the presence of my wife & bequeath to my grandson John Adams to him & his heirs & assigns for ever -

Then I give devise & bequeath to my grandson William Barrow Adams two hundred & fifty acres of land lying back of Edmund Adams mill pond to him and his heirs & assigns for ever -

Then I give devise & bequeath to my grandson John Adams ten acres of land I bought of Rodgers Jones to him & his heirs and assigns for ever I give to my son William Barrow the following negroes Dancy Stephen Realer Beth & Daniel -

I give to my daughter Elizabeth Rountree the following negroes Dina & all her increase or children Isaac & Jim and I give her my Case of Draper and all the things I have before put in her possession I give to my grandson John Adams the following negroes Peter Poll and all her increase or children Little Dany & Henry and all the articles and things I formerly I put him in possession of I also give the said John Adams one bed and furniture one new pair Cart wheels three halfs of my plantation tools viz. plow hoes & axes one large Looking Glass my large gun one half of my books one cross cut saw -

I give to my son William Barrow one horse or mare his choice I also give him one half of my stock of horses cattle & sheep I give to my daughter Elizabeth Rountree and her son John Adams to be Equally divided between them my stock of hogs -

I give Henry and William Barrow & my grandson -
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
