In the Name of God Amen I Robert Henry of the county of Hyde
and Province of North Carolina, being infirm in Body but in perfect
health do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in form
following that is to say I Give and Recommend my soul into
the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my Body I Recommend
to the Earth to be decently interred at the Direction of my Executors and
Touching such worldly Estate which it hath pleased God to bestow on me with
Will and Bequest in the following manner and form—

Item I Give and Bequest to my son Hugh Henry one feather Bed and
furniture belonging to the same at my wife Margarets death, and also one
cow and half, the said cow and calf to be delivered after my Executors hath
taken the due steps of the Law in Executing my will—

Item I Give and Bequest to my Daughter Jan one feather Bed and furniture
belonging to the same and also two sheeps, and one spinning wheel—

Item I Give and Bequest to my Daughter Sarah one feather Bed and furniture
belonging to the same, and also two sheeps, and one spinning wheel—

Item I Give and Bequest to my Daughter Margaret one shilling sterling in full of her
portion—

Item I Give and Bequest to my son Samuel Henry one shilling sterling in full of his portion—

Item I Give and Bequest to my Daughter Mary one shilling sterling in full
of her portion—

Item I Give and Bequest to my wife the use of all the rest of my Estate in
Good and out, and at her death to fall to my son Robt. and if their
should arise any Disturbance between my wife Margarets and
her son for her to take one third of the said Goods and chattels and for
him to keep the other part as his right and property, I likewise
constitute make and ordain Robert Henry the sole Executor of this my
Last Will and Testament and I do hereby utterly Disallow, revoke, and disannul
all and every other former Testament and Wills by me in any way before
named made and Bequeathed Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be
my last will and Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal my seal this seventh Day of April one thousand seven hundred
and seventy five.

In the Name of God Amen, I Nathaniel Tuley of Hpts County in the
Province of North Carolina, Being of full and perfect mind
and memory Thanks be to God for the same, do make and ordain
this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as
follows, First I Recommend my Soul to the hands of God that
gave it, and my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken
to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors here after Named

I send my well beloved wife Ann the one third part of my Estate
during her natural life. — I give unto my son
Cornelius Tuley ten pounds good money, unto him the heirs or
assigns, to be paid out of an Note of hand due me from my
son Nathaniel with lawful interest until paid.

I give unto my son Ephraim Tuley two pounds good money
to him his heirs and assigns to be paid out of a note of hand due
to me from my son Nathaniel Tuley, with lawful interest until paid.

I give unto my son Levy Tuley two pounds good money, to be paid out of a note
of hand due to me from my son Nathaniel Tuley, with lawful interest until paid.

I give unto the three last named, Viz. Cornelius, Ephraim and Levy, the over
plus of the note due me from Nathaniel to be Equally divided among them three.

I give unto my son in law Littleton Bell and his wife Ann, one new Rug and
Blanket, of a tolerable size, and ten pounds good money, to be paid
out of a note of hand due me from my son Jeremiah, with lawful
interest until paid.

I give unto my Daughter Mary Tuley one feather Bed one rug one
Blanket one sheet and ten pounds good money
over

to be paid out of a note of hand due me from my son Jeremiah,
with lawful interest until paid.

I give unto my Daughter Sarah Tuley one feather bed and one Rug one
Blanket one sheet and ten pounds good money, to be paid out
of a note of hand due me from my son Jeremiah, with lawful
interest until paid.

I give unto my son Jeremiah Tuley, one two year old heifer.

I give unto my son Nathaniel Tuley one two year old heifer.

I give unto my son Major Tuley one two year heifer.

I give and Bequeath all my Chattles that is not already
given or lent, to be Equally divided between my Sons and Daughters
Namely, Cornelius, Ephraim, Ann, Mary & Sarah,

I give my mare unto my son Levy Tuley, I give unto my son
Ephraim my young Black horse, I give all my stock to
be Equally divided between my Children, Namely, Cornelius,
Ephraim, Levy, Ann, Mary & Sarah.

I give unto my Children namely Cornelius, Ephraim,
Levy, Mary, Ann & Sarah all my manery and debts, that
is not already given or lent to be Equally divided between
the same. I except the third part of my house for the use of
my wife and the other two third to be Equally divided between Cornelius
Tuley, Ephraim Tuley, Levy Tuley, Ann Bell, and Mary Tuley, and Sarah Tuley.

I give unto my son Levy Tuley my old shooting gun.

I send unto my wife Ann the use of my Negro man Simon
during her natural life. — These the said negro to be Equally
divided between Cornelius Tuley, Ephraim Tuley, Levy Tuley, Ann Bell,
Mary Tuley & Sarah Tuley. I leave my horse Call Corn to be sold
and the money arising there from to be Equally divided
between Ephraim, Levy, Ann, Mary, Sarah. I leave the use of
my two work horses Coats and Mill unto my wife during her
life, then I give them unto Cornelius, Ephraim and Levy.

I send my wife one third part of my Household Furniture,
(that is not already given) during her natural life, and the
other two thirds, I give unto Cornelius, Ephraim and Levy,
Ann Bell Mary and Sarah. I give and Bequeath
unto my son Ephraim Tuley his heirs and assigns forever,
one hundred acres of Land in the swamp known by the
name of the Middle ground.
