

That time my will and desire is that at the Expiration of
 nine months after my Est^t has made choice of my negroes
 for my youngest Children that all my Estate not before
 given shall be Equally Divided betwixt my wife and all my
 Children by my Est^t Hereafter named and if they be
 fitt to sell any Child part that is under Eighteen years
 of age Excepting Negroes or Land I leave that to their own
 fully Discretionable Constitute and appoint my wife Frances
 Wilkins Est^t Patrick Wilkins John Wilkins and Edmond Wilkins
 and Retham Wilkins my whole and sole Ex^{ors} of this my
 Last will and Testament Disanulling all other wills by me
 made here before, Confirming this Only to be my Last will
 and Testament in Testimony whereof I have Hereunto set
 my hand and seal this Twelfth Day of September 1783.

In the name of God Amen I Robert Winfield of Hyde County in the State of
 North Carolina being of perfect and sound mind and memory thank
 unto God, but calling to mind the uncertainty of Death and knowing that it is
 appointed for all men once to die do make this my Last will and Testament
 in manner and form following first and principally I Recommend
 my soul unto Jesus Christ and nothing doubting but that the General
 Resurrection at the Last Day to Receive the same againe by the
 mighty Power of God, and as for my Body I Recommend to the
 Earth to be Buried in a Christianlike Manner at the Discretion
 of my Est^t Hereafter mentioned and as for such worldly Estate
 as it hath pleased God to bestow on me in this Life I give and
 Bequeath in manner and form following I give and
 Bequeath unto my well Beloved and personal Expence be
 all satisfied and paid. Item I give and Bequeath unto my well Beloved wife
 Wiltha Winfield the use and Occupation of the one third of my
 manner plantation whereon I now Live during her Widowhood
 with such utensils as plow Hoes and one cow. Item I give
 and Bequeath unto my well Beloved son Richard Winfield
 my manner plantation whereon I now Live, and all the Land
 hereunto Belonging containing one hundred and twenty four
 acres Be the same more or less one feather Bed and furniture
 and the other half of my Stock of Bush that is at my home
 plantation one Iron pot and looks to him and his heirs for
 ever. Item I give and Bequeath unto my well Beloved wife
 Wiltha Winfield one half of my Stock of sheep all my Stock
 of Hogs and half of my Stock of Bush that is at my home
 plantation at my decease one mare called fillace one
 feather Bed and furniture to her and her heirs for ever.
 Item I give and to my Daughter Ann Winfield one feather
 Bed and furniture to her and her heirs for ever.
 Item I give and Bequeath unto my well Beloved son Obadiah
 Winfield a plantation adjoining the plantation
 whereon I now Live lying on the East side of Jones Creek
 containing sixty acres Be the same more or less one
 feather Bed and furniture one gun to him and
 his heirs for ever.
 Item I give and Bequeath unto my well Beloved Daughter
 Cornelia

- Elizabeth Windfield one feather Bed and Furniture to Her and Her Heirs for Ever. I Give and Bequeath unto my son John Windfield one feather Bed and Furniture and Gun one Cow and Calf to Him and His Heirs for Ever.
- I Give and Bequeath unto my well Beloved Daughter Abigail Windfield one feather Bed and Furniture to Her and Her Heirs for Ever. I Give and Bequeath unto my well Beloved Daughter Beloved Daughter Hannah Windfield one feather Bed and Furniture to Her and Her Heirs for Ever.
- I Give and Bequeath unto my well Beloved Son William Windfield one feather Bed & furniture one Gun one Horse and Calf and Shovel and His Mother to Choose for him and of all my pott to Him & his Heirs for Ever.
- I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter in Law Martha Jones one feather Bed and furniture to Her and Her Heirs for Ever.
- I Give and Bequeath unto my well Beloved son James Windfield my Riding Horse called Henty to Him and His Heirs for Ever.
- I Give and Bequeath unto my two sons John and William Windfield one negro Boy called Diamond to be Equally Divided between them. But and if in case either of them Die without Law full Heirs then my will and Desire is that the Survivor of them two Should Have the Decedents part of the said negro Boy Diamond But if it should please God that both of them John and William should Die without Law full Issue then my Desire is that the said negro boy Diamond Should be Equally Divided between my four Daughters Ann Elizabeth Abigail and Hannah Windfield to them & their Heirs for Ever.
- I Give and Bequeath unto my wife Wiltha Windfield during her widowhood and to my son Richard Windfield until my youngest son William Windfield arrive to the age of twenty years for to work and Neighbor for the support and maintenance of my four youngest Children John Abigail Hannah and William and if either of them Die for the Neighbor support themselves of the Survivors before mentioned and if it please God that the said four Children all Live to my death and Desire is that the said ~~William~~ negro man Pomp

- Shall then belong to my youngest son William Windfield at or when he is ten years of age and it should so Happen that His mother should be then alive and not married that the said negro man Pomp Shall then Remain and Belong to my said son William Windfield and to His Heirs for Ever.
- I Give and Bequeath unto my negro woman called Daff to my wife and to my son Richard until my Daughter Elizabeth Windfield should arrive to the age of sixteen years and that the said negro woman Daff Shall Neighbor for the the support of my four youngest Children above named and if either of my said Daughter Ann or Elizabeth Windfield should Deceased without Issue then my Desire is that my Living Daughter should Enjoy the said negro woman and her Increase to Her and her Heirs for ever.
- I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Abigail and Hannah Windfield one negro Girl called Berehba provided tiller to age or marry But if either of them should Die without Law full Issue then my will and Desire is that the Survivor and my son William Windfield should inherit the same But if it should please God that both my said Daughters Abigail and Hannah should Die without Law full Issue then my will and Desire is that my son William Windfield should have and inherit the said negro Girl Berehba and her Increase to him and his Heirs for ever.
- I Give and Bequeath unto my well Beloved wife Wiltha Windfield the one third part of all my Stock of cattle not before mentioned towards the raising and supporting of my two youngest Children Hannah and William Windfield But if my said wife should Deceased or Decease then my will is that whatever Cattle is left at that time that they shall be Equally Divided between my two said Children Hannah and William Windfield to them and their Heirs for Ever.
- I Give and Bequeath all my Stock House hold Goods and moveables and every thing and things (wells and Articles) and of my whole Estate both Real and personal not before mentioned and I Give and Bequeath all in this my Will to be Equally Divided between my well Beloved Children Richard Ann Abigail Elizabeth John Abigail Hannah

and William Winfield to them and their Heirs for Ever.
 Lastly I constitute nominate and appoint my well Beloved
 Wife Wethy Winfield and my well Beloved Son Richard
 Winfield Ex^{or} and Ex^{or} of this my Last Will and Testament
 Revoking all other Will or Wills by me heretofore made Confirming
 and Declaring this only to be my Last Will and Testament
 In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and
 signt my seal this 21st Day of August 1780.

 and Memory Blessed be God. Do make this my Last will and Testament
 as follows:—I do give devise and Bequeath to my well Beloved wife Rebecca
 Ebome all my whole Estate Both Real and personal for and During
 the Term of Five years to be fully Completed and Ended and when so
 then I give Devise and Bequeath to my son Nathaniel Ebome the plantation
 and all the Land thereunto Belonging whereon I now dwell to live
 and his Heirs and assigns for Ever.

Item I give to my two sons William and Israel Ebome my negro
 man Quack But in case the Negro is unwilling to serve
 my will is that he be sold for one Hundred pounds
 specie or hired out yearly until my two sons last mentioned
 shall arrive to the age of Twenty one years of age.

Item I give to my two Daughters Mary and Colin Ebome
 fifty ten pounds each to divide between them.

Item After the term of Five years is Ended that I have mentioned
 to my wife the part of my Estate Except the particular
 Legacies, be Equally Divided between my wife and all my
 Children then Living and Lastly I do appoint my wife
 Rebecca Ebome Ex^{or} and my son Nathaniel Ebome Executor to
 this my Last will and Testament In testimony whereof I
 have hereunto set my Hand and seal this 27th of November 1783.
