

In the Name of God Amen I Parker Lacey bring Sick and Weak in Body but of sound mind and Memory thinketh belied for the same Doe make and Ordaine this my last will and Testament in manner and forme following that is to say first of all I Give and Bequeath my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God that gave it me and as for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Ex't and as for my worldly goods I give and Devise and Bequeath as follows To Wit I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Isaac Lacey the Place that I live on now containing one hundred acres of Land to him and his Heire and assigns forever — I give and Bequeath unto my Son Joshua Lacey Sixty five acres of Land lying betwixn the Cedar Post and Solomon Rews Great ditch Running direct from the Cedar Post to my back line from thence with Solomon Rews line to his Great Ditch to him and his Heirs forever I give and Bequeath unto my Son Adams Lacey one hundred acres Land lying on the West side of Solomon Rews Great ditch beginning at a mark'd pine Running with a line of marked trees to the corner of my new Patent from thence with the lines of my new Patent to Solomon Rews Line from thence to the Great Ditch to him his Heire & assigns forever I give and Bequeath unto my daughter Agnes Lacey two h'rs and Lands and 5 Pounds to purchase her a Cow and Calf I give and Bequeath unto Ann Lacey my Wife a Negro fellow by the Name of Harkless and all my Household Furniture to her and to hold during her life or widowhood after that to be Equally Divided amongst the above mentioned Children and if either goe unto my Son Isaac Lacey Thirty Pound Spanish Milled Silver to purchase him one Horse and further I give unto my Son Adam Lacey 1 young H'ar and the rest of my creatures to my Wife discretion to divide them amongst the four Children as she thinks proper — I give and Bequeath unto my Son John Lacey one Ese and Lamb and one barrel of corn to bye him a Son & Piggs with — Lastly I ordaine Constitute and appoint my Wife Ann Lacey My son Isaac Lacey and my son Adam Lacey Executrix and Executrix to their my best —

I give and Devise to my Son Edward Wornington after the Death or Marriage of my Said Wife the Land whereon I now live to him and his Heirs forever

I give and Request to my Seven Children to wit Edward, Rebecca, Mary, Butane Elizabeth Dorcas and Fanny Wornington after the Marriage or Death of my Wife all my Negroes viz, Dark Violet Cal & Anne Jack Sarah David and Jephie and Cain and Simon and their posterity together with my Stock Household and Kitchen Furniture to be Equally divided between them my Said Children

I appoint my Beloved Wife Mary Womington to be sole
Executor of this my last will and Testament signed with

mated for all men once to die do make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament as follows first and pri-

teth God and my Body to be Buried in the Earth
and as Touching such worldly which God in his
Mercy hath Blessed me with I Give and Dispose of
as followeth form and manner Imprimis
I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Abraham Jones one Cow
belonging to him and his heirs forever.

I Give and Bequeath to my two Sons Henry T. Jones and
David Jones all my lands and Rights in Land which
lie above the main Road West of where I now live and also a
tract of land which lies upon the nearest side of my road
and being part of a tract ab. by Col Jones to be my
Burdened one next page
