Last Will and Testament, in manner and form following (Viz)

I give unto my Loving wife during her Natural life
the Eastern of my Dwelling House together with 1 Bed and furniture
half dozen pewter plates two Dishes 3 Basins 1 Iron pot
1 Linen & 1 Woollen Wheel like mine 1 Negro Wench Named Edna
I give unto my Son Simon Bailey 1 Negro Boy Called Ely
and 1 Set of Carpenters Tools and 1 Gun

I give unto my Son Joshua Bailey 1 Negro Boy Named Picket and an Colled
Simpson & after his mother's Death 1 Negro Wench call'd Edna left
apart to his mother during her life I likewise give to him my Blacksmith
Tools my Beefst and furniture 1 Desk 1 Bed and
furniture 1 Bible of Oxen and Cows and all my Farming Tools
1 Hand Mill 1 Small Gun together with the Remaining part of
Stock Cattle Hogs & Horses and Sheep not otherwise disposed in this
Will I likewise devise and Bequeath unto my said Son Joshua
my Manner plantation where we now dwell containing two
Hundred and Eighty Acres.

I give to my Daughter Barchaba Williams 1 Negro Girl call'd Sylone
Half dozen pewter plates and 1 Cow and Calf

I give unto my Daughter Barbara Bailey 1 Negro Girl call'd
Tereby 1 cow and calf 1 Bed and furniture half dozen plates further
two Dishes Basins with my other Estate both indoors and out not
before Given I give to be Equally divided between my Son Joshua
and my Daughter Barbara Bailey

Lastly I constitute and ordain my Son Joshua Bailey whole & sole
Executor to this my Last Will and Testament hereby Ratifying this
as my last Will and Testament in Testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 16th Day of
December 1786

to god for the same but calling to memory the uncertainty of life do make this
my last will and Testament in manner and form following (Viz)

I give and Bequeath unto my youngest Brother George Daily all and Every of what
Estate I shall die possessed of whether Real personal or mixed and in case my said
Brother George should die Before me then I appoint my Brother William Daily my
Sole and only heir of all I shall die possessed of and I hereby make and appoint
Mr. Elizabeth Daily my Mother full and Sole Executor of this my last will and
testament hereby Revoking and Disannulling all former Wills by me made and Declaring this
only to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto

Hyde County I Ebon of the County & State aforesaid bring
Sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory
Thundate be to God for the same - do make and publish my last
Will and Testament in writing in manner and form following
That is to say -

Item I Give Devise and Bequeath unto my Son Ephraim Ebon one Hundred
and Twenty Acres of Land it being the Land he now lives on
Beginning at the Mouth of the mouth of a Branch call'd the Maple
Branch Extending the plantation he now lives on and the manner
Plantation that I now live on Running up the said Branch with the
Mouth thereof to the Head of the same and from thence to the
poplar Branch and from thence a Northwesterly Course to a main
line and with the same line to the main Branch and along the main
Branch to the first Station so as to include the said one Hundred and
Twenty Acres of Land to him his Heirs & assigns forever -
Also I give unto my said Son Ephraim Ebon Four Year old Stear
Whom and his Heirs forever

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Son in Law Henry Scott Twenty
Dollars Current Money of this State

Item I Give and Devise and Bequeath unto my Son Jacobus Ebon
the plantation and Land where on he now lives to begin at the Mouth
of a Gut to the Westward of my plantation Running up the said
Gut and the main Branch of the same to the Head thereof and from
thence Back to William Ebon's line so as to include 1 Hundred Acres
of Land to him and his Heirs forever - Also I Give Devise and Bequeath
unto my said Son Jacobus 1 Negro man named Jabe and 1 Negro
Girl named Rodolphina his Heirs and assigns forever

Item I Give Devise and Bequeath unto my Son John Ebon the manner
plantation where on I now live with the improvements on the same
to contain Three Hundred Acres of Land to Run to the Back line
of my Lands and joining the Lands given to my Son Eph. Ebon
for the said Three Hundred Acres of Land to him his Heirs & assigns
forever - Also I Give to my Son John Ebon one Negro Woman
named Doll and 1 Negro Boy named Josephine & his Heirs and assigns
forever.

Item I Give Devise and Bequeath unto my Son Samuel Ebon -

Two Hundred acres of Land on all the remaining part of my land
on the North Side of Snygo Creek to begin on the Lands given to my
Son Jacobus Ebon on the Branch rather back from his House to him
& his Heirs and assigns forever -

Item I Give Devise and Bequeath unto my Son Jacobus Ebon 1 other Tract
of Land lying on the South Side of Snygo Creek containing
one Hundred acres be the same more or less to him his Heirs and
assigns forever -

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Samuel Ebon 1 Negro man
named Dub and one Negro man named Prince and 1 feather Bed
and such furniture as belongs to it and twenty five pounds
current Money to him his Heirs and assigns forever

Item I Give Devise and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mearning Fudler
1 Negro woman named Dinah with what Children she now has and
also increase she may have hereafter and 5 Head of sheep and
Ten pounds current Money to her and her Heirs forever

Item I Give unto my Daughter Lydia Darden 1 Negro woman named
Lucy and what increase the said woman now hath and what
she may have hereafter to her during of her Natural life and
after the Death of my said Daughter Lydia Darden I Give the
said woman Lucy and her increase as aforesaid to the Children
of my said Daughter Lydia Darden Lawfully begotten of her Body
to be equally divided amongst them to them and their Heirs and
assigns forever

I Give to my Daughter Lydia Darden 1 Four Year old Stear

Item I Give Devise and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Ebon Four
Negroes to wit, a young Negro man named Tom Baltimore
one a Boy named Dick one a Girl named Bet the other a Girl
named Phency also 1 feather Bed and furniture and twenty
five pounds in currency to her and her Heirs forever

Item I Give Devise and Bequeath unto my Daughter Patsy Ebon 4
Negroes one named Tom Denny 1 Girl named Fanny 1 a boy named
Ruben the other a Boy named Buff one feather Bed and fur-
niture and twenty five pounds in Money to her and her Heirs
& assigns forever

Item I Give Devise and Bequeath unto my Daughter Lory Norman
Three Negroes to wit, a Negro woman named Jone

with what increase she may have hereafter a Negro Boy
named Ned & a Girl named Patience to her and her heirs assigns forever
Hence I give devise and bequeath unto my Grandson Henry George Negro
Boy named London one bow and bolt and a Brother Bed
and the furniture belonging to it being the Bed that I by me
my self provided my said Grandson should die before he
arrives to the age of twenty one year or Lawfull Age begotten
of his Body then my will and desire is that said Negro Boy
named London go to my Grandson Ephraim Ebom to him
his heirs & assigns for ever.

Hence I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Ephraim Ebom
our two year old Heifer also my Will is that my Exec^{ts} -
hereafter named do give or cause to be given to my said
Grandson Ephraim Ebom one year Schooling

Hence I give Devise and Bequeath unto my six children to wit
John Ebom, Jacobus Ebom, Saml Ebom, Mary Ebom, Patty Ebom
and Foy Hornman all the Rest of my Estate both within
to or and without not already given away in this my Will
to be Equally divided between them provided within of the last
mentioned Children die without their Lawfully begotten &c.
then part of this division to be divided between the survivors of the
said six children to them and their heirs for ever
further my desire is that my two Daughters Mary Ebom and
Patty Ebom have the benefit of this my Dwelling House & for a
Home until they marry or sooner choose to leave it and that no
Charge be Raised against them for the same

my will is further that the negro child Cuff given to my Daughter
Patty Ebom that the owner of the mother of the child keep it
and the mother of the same for the term of Eighteen Months without
any charge for the same without the owner of the child choose to
take it away sooner - It is my further will and desire that the
Executors hereafter mentioned do keep all the negroes left in this
my will to my two Daughters Mary & Patty Ebom until they
marry or sooner call for them and that my Executors make no charge
for keeping the said negroes but to have the use and Labor of
such as can work for the keeping of the gang at once
Lastly I constitute and appoint my sons
