Hyde Being very sick and weak in order to perfect health of
body But of sound & perfect mind and memory thank be given unto
God calling unto mind the mortality of my Body and knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain
This my last will and Testament That is to say principally
& first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the
earth to be Buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion
of my Executors nothing Doubting but at the great Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God
and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath
pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise &
dispose of the same in the following manner & form

I give unto my well beloved wife Hannah Clears all my house
hold furniture with one negro girl and child named Bess
and Arnett to her & her heirs forever and if it please God that
wife Hannah Clears and the child that she is with should die
then my will and desire is that the negro boy Arnett should
return to my sister Mary Clears to her & her heirs forever.
Likewise give all my cattle and hogs to my wife Hannah
Clears to her & her heirs forever — — —

I give unto my dear Brother John Clears one hundred and
sixty two acres of land to him and his heirs for ever until
my working tools and wearing apparel to his heirs forever
Also give to my well beloved Brother John Clears my father
John Clears Executors to this my last will & Testament
Revoking all will or wills to before former testaments with
privileges legacies & Executors by me in any wise before
named recited & bequeathed ratifying & Confirming this &
no other to be my last will and testament in witness
whereof I have unto set my hand and seal this 5th day
of April in the year of Our Lord 1793 — — —

In the name of God Amen, I Robert Gibbs Senior of the
State of North Carolina and County of Hyde being infirm
in body but of sound and disposing mind and memory
do make and ordain this my last will and testament
in form following that is to say I give and recommend my
soul into the hands of almighty God who gave it me and
my body I recommend to the Earth to be decently interred
at the discretion of my executors and touching such
worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I
will and bequeath it in the following manner — — —
Item, I give my son John Gibbs the land and plantation
whereon he now liveth at the Ridge containing one hundred
acres of land and one half the land at Middle Creek which
I bought of Henry Gibbs & John Gibbs, viz. that half lying
near the Creek also four negroes named Sam, Rose, Boston and one
Item, I give to my son Robert Gibbs the plantation whereon he
now liveth and all the land adjoining thereto to him
all that lies below a certain ditch which runs through my
plantation dividing the plantation on which he liveth
from my manor plantation & my will is that the
same course the said ditch bears shall be continued to
the southernmost bounds of my land and that he shall
have all the land to the Eastward of the said ditch and
line I also give him four negroes named — — —

January, Brister, Milly and Nan — — —
Item I give to my two sons Thomas Gibbs and Samuel Gibbs my place
plantation whereon I now live and all the land adjoining thereto
lying on the westward side of the ditch and line before
mentioned to be equally divided between them, — I give to
my son Thomas Gibbs one negro named Dave and one
named Pompey and one negro woman named Lucy & her
child named Ben also one bed & furniture six cows &
calves and iron pot, — I give to my son Samuel Gibbs two
negroes named Buff & Sam & one woman named Chaise
& the child named Elizah also one bed & furniture six
cows & calves and one iron pot. — — —

Item I give to my son William Gibbs one hundred acres of land
at the Ridge whereon the widow Bird now liveth, and one half
the land at Middle Creek which I bought of Henry Gibbs, & John
Gibbs Viz that half lying on the southward side of the tract
next to Caleb Mason's & Joseph Gibbs' land, I also give him
ten feet in width of land through the land adjoining
already bequeathed to my son John which said ten feet
in width of land is to be continued down to some
convenient part of Middle Creek for the purpose of training
my said son William Gibbs half of the land

Item four negroes, named Bader, Dix, Frank, Grace and Jack also
four hundred Spanish milled Dollars or the value thereof in
gold and one bed & furniture six cows and calves & iron pot

Item, I give to my daughter Nancy Jeannett four negroes named
Peter, Kate, Prudence and Beck also I give her six cows & calves
Item I give to my three grand children Robert, Elizabeth and
Anne Hopkins a negro woman named Sue and her increase
to be equally divided amongst them. — — —

Item I leave to my beloved wife Rachal Gibbs three negroes named Gill
January & Bet and four cows & calves, one feather bed & furniture
and iron pot during her natural life and after her
decease to be equally divided amongst all my children then
living I leave to my said wife the plantation and land
with the appurtenances already bequeathed to my son
William Gibbs during her widowhood it being the land
