Imprimis, I Give and Bequeath to my beloved Brother Dr. Sanderson a piece of Land lying on the west side of middle Creek Road which my Grand father John Spencer left me by will after the Death of my Grand mother

Item I Give and bequeath to my beloved Brother Sanders Sanderson one hundred acres of Land joining the Indian Line to the westward which my Father Richard Sanderson Deceased left me by will

Item I Give and Bequeath to my beloved Brothers Sanderson and Jers Sanderson jointly all the Residue or Remanent of my Estate which my Grand father John Spencer Deceased left me by will & also the remainder part which my father Richard Sanderson left me by will at his Deceased to be Equally Divided between my two Brothers Sanderson & Jers and if either of those above mentioned Brothers should Decease this Life without Lawfull heir or issue that then such Estate which I left which belonged to the Deceased shall devolve to the Surviving brother Sanderson or Jers Sanderson. Item I Give and appoint my mother Elizabeth Sanderson Executrix and my Cousin John Gibbs son of Henry Gibbs Deceased Executor of this my Last will & Testament In testimony therof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Seventh day of August 1790

I Thomas Daily Minister of the City of London bring in perfect mind & Health Praise be God for it do make this my last will and Testament as followeth Imprimis I Give and Bequeath to my Beloving wife Eliz Daily the sum of one hundred & seventy five pounds Current Money of this State to be Raised out of my Estate & what Goods and Chattels & as I may be Possessed of at the time of my Death or anterior to that amount as may be at her Discretion & what furniture I brought into this Country. Imprimis, I Give and Bequeath to my Son Sam^l Daily the sum of Two Hundred pounds Current Money of this State to be Raised as above mentioned or the Value thereof to be Raised in such Goods as he chooses which I may be possessed at the time of my Decease. Imprimis. I Give to my Daughter Jane the Sum of One Hundred pounds Current money of this State. Imprimis, I Give and Bequeath to my Son John Daily the Sum of thirty pounds & to my Son Thomas. Imprimis. I Give and Bequeath to my Son Thomas Daily the Sum of thirty pounds Current money. ^{the sum of thirty pounds to be paid after all my just debts are paid and then of that should not be brought left to pay the above Legacies} The above Legacies to be paid in proportion Continued on next page

In the Name of God Amen this 24th Day of December in the
year of our Lord 1790. Hugh Henry living on
Mattamusket in the County of Hyde being of a sound &
disposing mind & memory thanks be given to the Almighty
God for it and calling to mind the Mortality of my Body
& knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to Die
do make & ordain this my last Will and Testament that
it to say in manner & form as followeth Revoking and
Disannulling by these presents all and every Testament or
Testament Will or Wills heretofore by me made or declared either
by word or Writing and this is to be taken only for my last
Will and Testament & no other and now for the settling
my temporal Estate Goods Chattels & Debts as it
as it hath pleased God to bestow on me I do order give &
Dispose of the same in the following manner & form
I all those Debts I justly owe to any person to be truly
paid by my Executors hereafter named—

Item I give to my eldest Son John Henry Fifty Acres of Land
where I now live and one brother Bid

Item I give and Bequeath to my Son Robt. Henry the
other part of Fifty acres of Land joining his (and his wife's)
Brother John Bellows and one Feather Bed

Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Elender Hopkins one
Item I give and Bequeath to my all the rest of my Estate in Duwamps
to my wife During her Life and then to be Divided among my
other three Children, viz, Margaret, Samuel & Phoebe to be
Divided by my Executors and as for my Daughter Elizabeth
Hoskey she hath had her full Share of my Living
Likewise appoint my two sons John & Robert Henry the
Sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament
and I do hereby Disannul every former Testament by me
made willing & Bequeathing & Confirming this and no
other to be my last will & Testament—
