I have and Bequeath to my beloved Brother Richard Sanderson a piece of land lying on the west side of middle Creek Road which my Grand father John Spencer left me by will after the death of my Grand mother

Item I will and bequeath to my beloved Brother Sanderson one hundred acres of land joining the Indian Line to the westward which my Father Richard Sanderson dearely willed to me and Bequeath to my beloved Brother Sanderson and his Sanderson jointly all the Residue or Remanente of my Estate which my Grand father John Spencer did left me by will & also the remainder parte which my father Richard Sanderson left me by will at his death to be Equally diuided between my two Oldest Brothers Sanderson & Lewis and if either of those above mentioned Brothers should Depart this life without Lawfull Heire or issue that then such Estate which I left which Belonged to the Deceased Shall devolve to the surviving brother Sanderson or his Sanderson. Item I also constitude and appoint my mother Elizabeth Sanderson Executrix and my Cousin John Gibbs son of Henry Gibbs Deared Executor of this my Last will & Testament In testimony whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this

I give and Bequeath to my Beloving wife Eliz Daily the sum of one hundred & twenty five pounds Current Money of this State to be Raised out of my Estate & what Goods and Chattels & as I may be possessed at the time of my Death or articles to that amount as may be at her discretion & what furniture I brought into this Country Impinnes, I give and Bequeath to my Son Saml Daily the sum of Two hundred pounds Current Money of this State to be Raised as above mentioned or the Value thereof to be Raised in such Goods as shall choose which I may be possessed at the time of my decease Impinnes.

I give to my Daughters Jane the sum of One Hundred Pounds Current money of this State Impinnes, I give and Bequeath to my Son John Daily the sum of Thirty Pounds £ 30 & Twenty Pounds to his Son Thomas Impinnes.

I give and Bequeath to my Son Thomas Daily the sum of Thirty Pounds Current money of this State to be paid up to all my just debts are paid and then if there should not be enough left to pay the above Legacies the same to be Proportioned

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and I will and constitute my son Sam'l Daly and my  
Wife Eliz. Daly my Sole Executive - Revoking all former  
Will & Writures whereof I have set my hand and seal  
This 31<sup>st</sup> Day of August Ad. 1788

In the Name of God Amen this 24<sup>th</sup> day of December in the  
year of our Lord 1790. Hugh Henry living on  
Massachusetts in the County of Hyde being of a sound &  
disposing mind & memory thanks be given to the Almighty  
God for it and calling to mind the Mortality of my Body  
& knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to Die  
I do make & ordain this my last Will and Testament that  
into say manner & form as follows with Respecting and  
Disavowing by these presents all and every testament or  
Instrument & Will or Wills heretofore by me made and declared either  
by word or Writing and this is to be taken only for my last  
will and Testament & no other and now for settling  
my temporal Estate Goods Chattels & Debts as it  
and it hath pleased God to bestow on me I do order give &  
Dispose of the same in the following manner & form  
all those debts I justly owe to any person to be truly  
paid by my Executors here after named.

Item I give to my Eldest Son John Henry Fifty Acres of Land  
where I now live and one brother Bed

Item I give and Bequeath to my Son Robt. Henry the  
other part of Fifty acres of Land (Joining his)  
Brother John Bellard and one Brother Dick

Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hopkins and  
Item I give and Bequeath to my all the rest of my Estate in Daunys  
to my wife during her life and then to be divided among my  
other three children viz. Margaret, Samuel & Abel to be  
Divided by my Executors and as for my daughter Elizabeth  
Hopkins she shall had her full share of my living  
Likewise appoint my two sons John & Robert Henry the  
Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament  
and I do hereby Disavow every former Testament by me  
made willing & Bequeathing & confirming this and no  
other to be my last will & Testament.
