Item I Give unto my son in Law Abraham Cutchet one Cow & Lamb
and what House Hold Goods with him have in time past &
and no more of my Estate of any kind Whatsoever

Item I Give unto my Beloved Daughter Sarah Windley and her heirs
Lawfully Begotten by Samuel Windley one negro Girl
named Jude and her Increase for ever also I Give unto my
son in Law Samuel Windley and Sarah his wife one negro Boy
named James to them and their heirs for ever also one feather Bed & furniture

Item all the rest of my Estate both real Personal Land and my Beloved
wife Dinah Cording during her natural life or widowhood meaning
my Lands Negroes House Hold Goods and Stock of Cattle &c. all Rights &c.

Item after my wife's Decease I Give unto my two sons John Will Cording
and William Cording all my Whole Estate that I have lent into my
wife meaning all my Lands Negroes Stock of Cattle &c. not before
Given to them and their heirs for ever to be Equally Divided between
them &c.

I nominate and appoint John Satchwell and my two sons
John Will Cording and William Cording Executors of this
my Last Will and Testament to Execute the same
according to my true Intent and Meaning and Lastly
I hereby make Ordain Publish and Declare this to be my
Last will and Testament in Testimony where of I have
hereunto set my hand & seal

and that I do Hereby Authorise and Give him full power
to act as he may think most fit as tho I my self

was personally there until my above said Childs come of age or he might think fitt to deliver the above said negroes Ralifying and Confirming this and no other to be my Last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have Here unto set my Hand and fixed my Seal this Twentieth day of August one Thousand seven Hundred and Eighty Three
