 that it is appointed for all men once to die, I Recommend my  
 soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it and my  
 Body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion  
 of my executors and touching this worldly affair wherein  
 it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give in the manner  
 and form following that is to say

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin Bomer  
 my plantation lying on the north side of Lake and one farm —

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy Bomer  
 one feather bed and furniture one pot and one skillet  
 and two puter plates and one halfe Gallon Bason to be  
 and remain her property as long as she lives and at  
 her death for to be equally divided amongst my children

Item I give all the Remainder part of my Estate to be Equally  
 divided amongst my four children Tabith Bomer,  
 Elizabeth Bomer, Willey Bomer & Ben. Bomer  
 excepting so much as will pay all my Lawfull debts  
 and that my will is that Martha Bomer & Isaac Swindell  
 shall be my whole & sole executors to this my Last —  
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will and testament in witnesses whereof, I have  
 hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal This 11 day  
 of October in the year of our Lord 1794 —
