

In the Name of God Am<sup>l</sup> William Campbell of Hyde County Being Sick and Weak in Body but of Sound mind and the more blessed be God do put this my Last Will and Testament in Writing as follows -

I thus

I Give Devise and Bequeath unto my son Vined Campbell my Third part of the Saw Mill and my half part of the first mill and Mill Dam and my Third part of the Land Belonging to said Mill Lying on Broad Creek also my Part of the Land Taken up in partu ship with Joseph Hancock which said Mill & Land & appurtenances I Give to my son Will<sup>m</sup> Campbell and his heirs and assigns for ever I Give to my son Will<sup>m</sup> Campbell one Horse called Dubaud and my Riding Saddle one Feather Bed and furniture and my Quirt to him and his heirs for ever.

I thus

I Give to my son Edm<sup>d</sup> Campbell my mare and my daughter Bitches together with what thing I have already given him in possession that is in full of his part of my Estate.

I thus

I Give to my Daughter Susannah Cane one feather Bed and furniture including what Side Saddle also one large pewter Bacon scale Gallon D<sup>r</sup> and these things to be her part of my Estate.

I thus

my Will is that my son Vined have the use and Rightbor of my Negro woman Nance for six years for which Labor of said negro my son Vined shall Give my son Noah Campbell two years schooling and support my son Noah during the said six years he has the negro woman Nance without further price or Cost to him and it is further my Will that in case the said negro Nance should have Children in the six years the first Borned a Son I Give to my son William Campbell, and the next that is borned a Son I Give to my Daughter Susannah Cane that the 10 Children in the six years she is to stay with my son Vined and not borned afterwards My further Will is that my daughter Susannah Cane have the use and Rightbor of my negro girl Luce for six years paying her Taxes and finding her clothes,

Carried over

I thus

I Give & Bequeath to my son Noah Campbell My negro woman Nance & my negro girl Luce to him this heire for ever also my Bay mare called Luce one Feather Bed and furniture provided also that the first man cut that shall come of the said mare I Give to my son Vined and that I will have the use of p<sup>r</sup> more Luce six years for Raising the cattle she shall bring for my said son Noah.

I thus

my Will is that the Remainder of my Estate not here in mentioned I Give the same to my three said (Viz) Vined William and Noah Campbell to be Equally Divided between them and Lastly I appoint my son Vined Campbell and my friend George Barrow Esq<sup>r</sup> of this my Last will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twelfth day of March in the year of Our Lord 1783
