In prime of age and Begueth my Right to negro Girl Edith to my sister Elizabeth Salterthwaite & her heirs (my nephew Thomas) Latham one bed & furniture Likewise one Dressing Room The Estate that I have inherited to and of my father property to my wife Peggy W. Latham together with all my wearing apparel & give one bed & furniture to my niece Wendish Jordan together with all my stock of cattle hogs & sheep I give my living my other bed to be sold to purchase some slaves to the use of the Body of my Late husband John Tyson. And all the property purchased at John Tysons Tavern and not here otherwise disposed of together with all debts due me to be appropriated to the payment of my debts and if any remain after the debts paid I give unto Elizabeth Salterthwaite — and further bequeath to my first my Brother Thomas Jordan my Brother in law Dr. Henry Embury of this my Last will. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 3rd day of November 1812—

In the name of God Amen I William Corboring of the County of Hyde Bury in body calling to mind the certainty of Death do make this my Last will and testament as followeth. I give unto my son James Corboring all my Land and the north west side of Range Creek to him & his heirs forever, also half of my Land at Middle bay then I give unto my son Laurence Corboring my Manor Plantation, and Land, whereon I now live and the other half of my Land at Middle bay to him and his heirs forever. — I then I give unto my well beloved wife Mary Corboring one negro man named Moses one negro woman named Jane and Dr. Harriet Poline to her & her heirs forever. I then I give unto my son James Corboring one negro man, named Prince one negro boy named James one negro girl named Pileas. I then I give unto my son Laurence Corboring one negro boy named James one Dr. named Harry one negro girl named Eliza to him & his heirs forever. I then, all the residue of my Negroes I give unto my Daughters namely Emily Mary Malinda and Elizabeth Corboring & Thomas & their heirs forever. I then my Desire is that none of my Estate shall be sold or aliened and my estate shall be thought of properly by my Executors. Lastly I appoint my wife Brother, James and John Salterthwaite Executors to this my Last will and testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 2nd day of December 1812
