I give to my son John Adams a parcel of Land called the Holly
Ridge Containing an hundred and four acres and the
first bolt of my Young man that shall here after will to my son
William Adams likewise my old mare called Jane and
Great post, one hand mill Two Cows and Calves that is
Called the said John Adams

Item I do give to my son William Adams the Land and plantation
I now live on containing Eighty acres one Cow & yearling
one Cow and Calf that is now called the said William
Adams an young of man called Phoenix.....
my will and desire is that all the remainder and Residue of my
Estate be Equally divided Between my wife and two Sons
John and William Adams.
