Item I desire that if any of my Estate be sold it may be Equally
Divided among my children that is if sold by way of
Debrand I desire that my three Sons Isaac Jacob &
Aaron may have the privilege of Selling Land or negroes until
they are thirty years of age. Item I desire that if any of
my children die without Heir that the Estate I give them may
be Equally Divided among the Rest of my children.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Isaac Jacob and Aaron and Daughter
Eliz. th I also bequeath the Dower of my wife Eliz. Wilkinson
all the Estate with the increase of my good cattle &c which I leave
During her widowhood or life to be Equally Divided amongst
them. Item I likewise Consider and Appoint my well
Beloved wife Executrix and also my son Isaac Executor of
this my last will and Testament and I hereby utterly
disallow revoke and Disannul all and Every other former Testament
In witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this fourteenth
Day of December in the year of Our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and seventy eight.

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In the Name of God Amen. The thirteenth of March and in the year
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Eighty William Gibbs.th
of the County of Hyde and in the State of North Carolina being weak in Body
but of perfect mind and memory Bless be God I therefore calling to mind
the mortality of my Body and that it is appointed for all men to die I do hereby
ordain this my Last will and Testament that is to say principally first of all
I give and recommend my soul to the hands of God that gave it and my Body
hereunder to the Earth to be Buried in a decent Christian burial at the
Discretion of Executors hereafter mentioned not doting but at the
General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty
Power of Almighty God and astonishing such wondrous Estate wherewith it
hath pleased God to dress me with in this life I give and dispose in the
same in the manner and form following First I give and devise to my Eldest
son William Gibbs two hundred acres of land whereon he now liveth
and upwards and am negro fellow named of Tom and two hundred cattle
that none at his one pair Item I give and devise to my son Eliz. Gibbs one
half of the land I now live on Item I give and devise to my son
Jermiah Gibbs the Southard half of the Land I now live on.

Item I give and devise to my son Benjamin Gibbs that Land whereon the
widow Bennett now liveth and one negro Boy called George one feather Bed
and furniture and one young man and three cows and calves

Item I give and devise to son Joe Gibbs one negro gall called Nam
and one hundred and fifty Pounds in Gold and Silver and three cows
and calves and further to my will and devise that he shall be put to
school when he cometh to the age of ten years and kept to school
till he is fifteen years old out of my Estate and further it
my will and devise he shall then be Bound to a trade other
Goldsmith or a Tabor Item I give and devise to my daughter Mary
Spencer one negro woman named Rose and one Negro Boy named
Bob and one hundred pounds in State money Item I give
and devise to my daughter Elizabeth Gibbs one negro gall called
Esther and one feather Bed and furniture and three cows and
calves and one hundred Pounds to my daughter and one hundred
Daughter Sarah Gibbs one negro gall called Turner and one hundred
and furniture and three cows and calves and one hundred
Pounds Item I give and devise to my daughter Ann Gibbs
one negro gall called Darkie and one feather Bed and
furniture and three cows and calves and one hundred Pounds
Carried over

Item I Give and Devise to my daughter Rebecker Gibbs one negro
fall called Rig car and one feather Bed and furniture
and three cows and calves and one hundred Pounds
Item I Give and Devise to my Grand Daughter Agnes Janis as
much money as will make two hundred Pounds with which she shall
have sides of Land further it may well if Selby or former should
die without I pur that then the Survivor of them shall have the other
part of his Land and all the Rest of his Estate and further it
my will I will add & say that if my son Benjamin Dies
without Issue that then his Brother Thomas shall inherit his
Land. Since and sealed and signed over to William Gibbs, (Sic)
and Negro further it my will and Devise that if either of my
son younger Daughter Should Die without Issue that then
the Survivor of them Shall inherit her Estate Equally amongst
them further it my will and Devise that my Negro fall wife named
Selby shall have the use of my Estate During her life and further
I appoint my two sons Selby Gibbs and Benjamin Gibbs my sole and
sole Executors of this my Last will and Testament and that
upon all my Debts and Legacies is paid that then shall be divided
equally divide the Remainder of my Estate both Real and
Personal and Lastly I do hereby Revoke all former and all
other will or wills by me made and declare this to be my last will
and Testament. In witness whereof the said William Gibbs has
hereunto set my Hand and Seal this thirteenth day of March in
fourth year of our Independance and in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and Eighty.

In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas Ellison of Hyde County in the
State of North Carolina Being sick and weakly Body but sound & disposing
mind and memory thank be to God and calling to mind the uncertainty
of this transitory Life Do make & ordain this my last will and Testament
in manner and form following (U.S.) I will Recomend my soul to its
maker nothing desiring a proprieatess of all my sins my Body to the last
to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter nominated
attaching my worldly Estate I give Divide & dispose as follows

I Give and Bequeath to my Beloved wife Ann Ellison a negro
Woman called Taff and a negrowench called Jenny and her youngest
Child also a negro fellow called Jack a negro fall called Egge a negro
girl call Phyllis also my slave named Lou Bide & Furniture & all the rest of my
Household furniture Except the two large Looking Glasses & my
Book Case and Desk it stands on.

I Give Devise & Bequeath unto myself Oldest son Robert West Ellison all
the Land I Bought of John Jordan also all the Stock of that Cattle thorow
also I Give & Devise to my said son Robert West Ellison my land to
Plantation Long acre containing about two hundred acres Recurring
to my wife Ann Ellison during her natural Life the Plantation and
House in the said Acre beginning at a cross pine near the far Palen
running to the south end line also Recurring to Charles Letham & his
King & half an acre of the said two hundred acres of land in Long acre
beginning at the North End line of my said Land running down the said
line for the compliment I also give and Bequeath to my said son
Robert West Ellison all my lands in Long acre Excepting three hun-
dred & twenty in an entry I have for six hundred & forty acres
on the East side of Long acre ridge & Excepting two hundred acres
in an entry I have on the East side of Long acre ridge for three
hundred and twenty acres I also leave give and bequeath to my
said son a negro fellow named London & his wife Viola
& her four children also a negro fellow named Will his wife
Cora & her child also two negro boys called Shad & George also
a negrowench called Jude & her child Sam also a negro fellow
called Sam and a negro boy called Luther to him & his wife for ever

Carried over
