And what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and Bequeath in manner following — Viz —
I give and Bequeath unto my two Daughters Betty and Lucretia the Manor Plantation whereon I now live with all my lands in the Bay also fifteen acres joining of Richard Winfield to them and their heirs for ever

Item I give and Bequeath unto my two Daughters Rebecca and Margaret all my Land that I had by my wife Susan and their heirs for ever

Item I give and Bequeath unto Sally Nancy & Richard Kitch all the Land I Bought from Thomas Kitch to them and their heirs for ever

Item I lend to my beloved wife a negro by the name of Dunt two years after the Ratification of these presents and at the expiration of which time I give the said Negro Dunt one Bad and Belled one Chest to Peter Smith him and his heirs for ever

Item I give all the cattle that is in the mark of Betty to her and all the cattle that is in mark of Rebecca to her and her heirs for ever

Item I give to my Daughter Lucretia two Cows & Calves

Item I give to my Daughter Margaret two Cows & Calves

Item I lend unto my beloved wife Rose Dick & Jobe with all the remainder of my perishable property except my negroes and so much of my perishable property as will pay my debts to be Judged of by my Executors during her life and then to be divided amongst my Children before mentioned

Item I give and Bequeath all my negroes that is not already given or lent to be Equally divided between my four Children namely Betty Rebecca Lucretia and Peggy Winfield to them and their heirs for ever

Item My will and Desire is that if Peter Smith should die without Lawfull Issue that in that Case the property that is given him to be Equally divided ~~between~~

Lastly I constitute and appoint my Beloved wife Betsy Winfield and William Clark Executor & Executor to this my last will and Testament Revoking all others by me made in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 21st of March 1799

Item I give unto my Daughter Ann Howard one bed and furniture two Cows and Lining Wheel

Item I give to my Daughter Faltitia Howard one bed & furniture two Cows and Lining Wheel

Item I give my loom and Gens and tackle unto my two Daughters Faltitia and Ann Howard during their continuance to father

Item All the residue of my estate I give unto all my Children

 And I give unto Elizabeth my Brother John Selby three —

Children namely Britannia Selby William Selby and Elizabeth Selby
 all my Personal Estate except what I got by my wife to be
 equally divided between them & their heirs and assigns for ever
 And I give unto Elizabeth Hambleton & Josiah Hambleton all the
 household goods & furniture that my wife had before I
 married her to have and hold to them their heirs & assigns for ever
 Lastly I constitute and ordain my beloved wife Elizabeth Selby
 & John Selby my Executors to this my Last will and testament
 Ratifying & confirming this to be my Last will and testament
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & fix my seal
 this fifteenth of January in the year of our Lord one
 thousand seven hundred & ninety nine —
