In the name of God Amen, the sixth day of August AD, I Andrew
Hyde County and State of North Carolina Being weak and sick
in body but of perfect mind and memory, thank be to God, for the
same do make and ordain this my Last will and testament
that is to say Principally and first of all, I give & Recommend
my soul to God that gave it and my body to the Earth to be
buried in a decent manner, and as to my earthly Estate
which it hath pleased God to Endow me with, I give and
bequeath in manner & form following. I then, I give and
bequeath unto my son Jacob Connor one dollar & then
I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Connor one
evil table after my death. I then, I give and bequeath unto my
Daughter Mary Connor the half of a negro boy Jim after my death
I then, I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Connor
one negro Girl named Edney and one Iron pot. I then, all the
Rest of my property which I possd after my decease I give
unto my three Daughters namely Ann Connor, Mary Connor
& Mary Connor, and if either of the three afore named
Girls should Die without Lawfull heirs my will is that

The succeeding one or two should inherit the whole. Lastly,
I do hereby hand & appoint my Brother in law, James Barron Executor
to this my Last will and testament & Decembling & following & paying
all other bills or bonds here to by me made allowing & satisfying

In the name of God Amen, I William Mullison being sick and weak
of Body but of a sound disposing mind and memory, thank
be to God, and calling to mind the mortality of man and that it is
appointed for all men, once to Die I do make this my Last
will and testament in manner & form following. First I
Recommend my soul in the hands of God who gave it and my
body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter
mentioned, and as for such worldly Estate as it hath pleas-
ed God to bestow upon me I give and bequeath in writing
as follows. I first, I bequeath to my well beloved wife
Sarah Mullison my house & plantation whereon I now live
and all that belongs thereto During her natural Life or
widowhood. I then, I bequeath to my well beloved wife Sarah
Mullison During her natural Life or widowhood all my
Negro and stock all that I possess and all my household
furniture. I then, I give and bequeath unto my well beloved
son Christopher Mullison after my wife's death the
part of Land my house & in beginning of a history on the
Eastern side of the branch on the River where you go to

 Lives and then I give them to their children and law fully grown
 of her body I give to my daughter Elizabeth Mallison of my

 trunk one spill Martin then after my wife Sarah's Decese I
 give to my son Benjamin E. Mallison one negro man named
 Bob & one negro boy named Luke & one bed & furniture and Case
 and six Chairs one pair of plated Candles stands then I give
 and bequeath to my well beloved son Christopher Mallison
 after my wife's Decese one negro boy named Bob and one negro boy
 named Stephen one bed & furniture and one bow set and what
 furniture & bellings he it one Looking Glass one square table
 one pair Brass Candle sticks and one knife Case then after
 my wife's Decese I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary
 M. Cummer one negro boy named Tom one bed & furniture
 half dozen silver table spoons & half dozen teaspoons one
 Buss & Glass and if my negro woman Scott should have
 and other Child I give it to my Daughter Mary M. Cummer & me
 I am then after my wife's Decese I give and bequeath to
 my son Francis Mallison one negro boy named Jack &
 one negro woman named Luckam further bed & furniture
 one silver chadle one Table and Chair then after my wife's
 Decese I give and bequeath to my daughter Claire Mallison one
 negro girl named Lucy half dozen silver teaspoons one pair
 silver sugar tongs one feather bed & furniture and one Looking
 Glass and Looking Glass - I give all the Rest of my house hold
 furniture after the Decese of my wife to my son Christopher
 D. Mallison after the Decese of my wife Sarah Mallison
 my will I desire is that all my stock should be divided by
 two for & holden Equally between all my children -

my will & desire is that if either my sons Christopher or my son
 should die without Lawfull heirs together by their heirs my desire is
 that the Survivor should have the whole of my Land. I hold in Walter
 Pollard bought of Henry Ellg. I then I give to my well beloved wife Sarah
 Mallison all the money that is due me at the Northward post holding power
 Lastly I nominate constitute & appoint my well beloved wife Sarah
 Mallison and my two sons Christopher Mallison & Francis Mallison
 Executors & Administrators to this my last will & testament. Nothing all the
 will or wills heretofore made allowing this only to be my last
 in testimony hereof. I have put my hand & Affixed my seal
 this 20th August 1811.
