and Wroth in body But of sound disposing Mind and
knowing Thanks be to God for it and Calling to Mind
the uncertainty of this Mortal Life I do hereby Make and
Ordain this my Last Will and Testament in Manner and
Form as follows Viz. First my Will and Desire is that
my body Buried in a Decent Like Manner and my
Funeral Expences and my Just Debt and Liabilities be paid
at the Discretion of my Executor herein of the Nationall
I Give to my Will bequeath Wife all and singillar my Goods
and Chattels and my Whole Estate During her Widowhood
and after her Death an Equal Part of my Whole Estate During
her Widow Life to be Divided at the Discretion of my
Executor. In Premises, I Give Divise and Bequeath unto my Son
William Webster the Land and Plantation Lying and being
the Town of Hardscote Back Old and New Potuit Excepting
the Plantation known by the Name of Hardscote to him
and his heirs forever also One Negro Tuleen Named Ned also
One Troth Bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.
Then I Give Divise and Bequeath unto my son John Webster
the Parcel of Land Lying on Smiths Deciding Creek beginning
Jacob Corners to him and his heirs forever also one Negro
Jeller Named Ph also one Troth Bed and furniture
to him and his heirs forever.
Then I Give Divise and Bequeath unto my son James
Webster the Land and Plantation known by the Name of
and all the Swamp Land wherein I have begun to clear
to him and his heirs forever also a Negro boy Named Joseph
and one Troth Bed and furniture to him and his
heirs forever.
Then I Give Divise and Bequeath unto my Daughter
Elizabeth Webster the Land and Plantation known by
the Name of Hardscote to her and her heirs forever
also one Negro woman Named Gots also one bed and
furniture to her and her heirs forever.
Then I Give Divise and Bequeath unto my Daughter
Sue Webster the Land and Plantation known by the

Name of Faurmans Fork on Jordons Creek Running
out a Long a Small Creek up to the bridge from thence
across to a Swamp to John Webster line Running by the
Swamp first Joining the Brother James Webster Landed to her
and her heirs forever also one Negro Girl Named Sarah
also one Troth Bed and furniture to her and her heirs
forever. My Will and Desire is that the Land and Plantation
that I Took Back from William Davis Lying up Pauls Gap
should be sold at the Discretion of Executor to pay Debts and
that after the Death of my said Deceased Wife Katherine that
my whole Estate then left Besides the Legacies should be Equally
Divided between all my children that is to say my son William
Webster Elizabeth Webster John Webster Peabrooks Webster and
James Webster also my Will and Desire is that my Wife
Katherine Webster should be Executrix and Samuel Smith
and John Webster Executors in all Excess act according
to the Tenor of this my Last Will and Testament Destroying
and Revoking all other Wills by me Made Before or
Executed, Signed sealed and pronounced this second
Day of February and in the Year of our Lord one Thousand
Seven Hundred and Seventy and in the presence of us,
John Webster
William Webster
Elizabeth Webster.
