This Twenty sixth day of february Anno Domini 1768—  
I William Wilkinson of Hyar County in the Province of  
North Carolina being sick and weak of Body but of perfect  
Senses and memory blessed be God for it so constituted and  
ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say  
first I give and bequeath my soul to God that gave it me  
and my Body I Commit to the Earth to be Buried a Chris-  
tian like manner and as for what worldly Goods the Lord  
in his Mercy hath been pleased to bestow on me I give  
and bequeath as follows. In presence I give to my son  
William Richard Wilkinson the Plantation Whom I now dwell  
with four hundred acres of Land lying on the South side  
of the mouth of Swains Creek I owning and Relinquishing  
my Wife to have a Right in the said Land and that  
she shall not be Disturbed of using and Enjoying the said  
plantation During her Natural Life and after her decease  
wholly to my Son William Rich Wilkinson and his heirs  
lawfully begotten of his Body forever. Thus I give to my  
Daughter Sabraugh Wilkinson one hundred acres of Land lying  
on the East side of Goose Creek it being a tract of Land  
I bought of John Mayo to her and her heirs forever.  
Thus I give to my daughter Dinah Wilkinson, one hundred  
acres of Land lying between John Inwards and Bay Russell  
upon the Great bridge to her and her heirs forever. Thus  
I give to my daughter Sabraugh Wilkinson, one horse and  
carp. Thus I give to my Grand son Shadrach Wilkinson one  
cow and carp. Thus I leave one half of my next Cattle and  
one half of my Sheep to be Equally divided between my  
three Children Male and female. Thus I give I send the other  
half my Cattle and Sheep that I have not already given  
away to my Wife Sarah Wilkinson one mare and the Saddle  
I give to my three Children the first Cattle to my daughter  
Sabraugh Wilkinson, and the second to my daughter  
Dinah Wilkinson, and the third Cattle to my son William  
Richard Wilkinson. Thus I give to my daughter Sabraugh  
Wilkinson, one good full grown Bull one black cat, Thus
