law William Campbell to be Executors of this my last
Will and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and fixed my seal this 21st day of October
in the year of Our Lord 1767.

This County sixth day of February anno Domini 1768—
I William Wilkinson of Tyrrell County in the Province of
North Carolina being sick and weak of Body but of perfect
Senses and Memory blessed be God for it do constitute and
ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say
first I give and bequeath my soul to God that gave it me
and my Body I commit to the Earth to be Buried a Chris-
tian like manner and as for what worldly Goods the Lord
in his Mercy hath been pleased to bestow on me I give
and bequeath as follows. I give to my Son
William Rich Wilkinson the Plantation wherow I now dwell
with four hundred acres of Land lying on the South side
of the Marsh of Pungo, land Savory and Relieving
my wife to have a Right in the said Land and that
she shall not be disturbed of using and Enjoying the said
plantation During her Natural Life and after her decease
wholly to my Son William Rich Wilkinson and his heirs
lawfully begotten of his Body forever. Item I give to my
Daughter Deborah Wilkinson one hundred acres of Land lying
on the East side of good Creek it being a tract of land
I bought of John Mayo to her and her heirs forever.
Item I give to my daughter Dinah Wilkinson one hundred
acres of Land lying between John Indians and Bay Passel
upon the Great Bridge to her and her heirs forever Item
I give to my daughter Deborah Wilkinson one hoss and
calf Item I give to my Grand son Shadrict Wilkinson one
hoss and calf. Item I leave one half of my next cattle and
one half of my sheep to be equally divided between my
three children male and female Item I give I leave the other
half my cattle and sheep that I have not already given
away to my wife Sarah Wilkinson an mare and the moneys
I give to my three children the first belt to my daughter
Deborah Wilkinson and the second to my daughter
Dinah Wilkinson and the third belt to my son William
Rich Wilkinson. Item I give to my daughter Deborah
Wilkinson one good full feather Bed one black Cat. Item
I give and bequeath to my Daughter Dinah Wilkinson

 Wife the plantation wheron I now live during her Natural Life and
 after her decease to my son John Estes to him and his heirs forever
 thus I give to the child my wife goes with if a boy two hundred acres
 of Land that is in a tract Surveyed during my marriage ~~Plantation~~
 with a Right in the Morph of a hundred acres of my ~~new~~ Survey
 and if Girl my will is that the Two hundred acres of Land in my
 Back Survey and his hundred acres in the Morph of my New
 Survey be Equally diuided betwix the child my wife now goes with
 and my Daughter Sarah Estes and my Daughter Abby Estes to them
 and their heirs forever thus I give to my Daughter Hufamy Estes the
 Plantation and Land which I bought of Thomas Gedney Savery
 my wifes third in it during her Natural Life and wright of five
 acres of the sd Land with half the Orchard to my son John Estes during
 his Natural Life and after his decease equally to my Daughter
 Hufamy Estes to her heirs forever — thus I leave one Negro Man
 called Sam to be sold by my Executor, and the Money to be laid out
 to the use of buying another which I leave to my wife Catharine
 Estes during her Natural Life and after her Death to my son
 John Estes and his heirs forever thus I leave to my wife Catharine
 Estes One Negro girl Called Jane during her Natural Life and
 after her decease I give the said Negro girl to my Daughter Hufamy
 Estes Except the Envelope of the sd Negro girl if she breed I give
 the first child she brings to my Daughter Sarah Estes and the second
 child she brings to my Daughter Abby Estes and the third child she
 brings to the child my wife now goes with thus I give to my
 daughter Hufamy Estes the ant Castle that is in her mortgaged
 with a Crop and Split and can hit the Right year and can
 hit the left year, thus and thus increase thus I give to
