

State of North Carolina February the 7th Day 1791

Hyde County I Winfield Gaylord being sick of Body but of perfect mind will and memory thanks be to God for the same but calling to mind the mortality of Life I make this & ordain this to be my Last will & Testament in manner and form following.

First I Recommend my soul into the hands of God that God I and my Body to be Decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors first my funeral Expenses and all other Debts to be paid at the Discretion of my Executors

Item I Give and Bequeath to my four Children Jeremiah Gaylord Mary Gaylord Bursaba Gaylord Henry Gaylord John Gaylord all my out standing Debts of any kind all stock property to be Equally divided between the before named Children Likewise I appoint my trusty friends Jeremiah Gaylord & Arthur Ables to be my Executors to this my Last will and Testament

In the Name of God Amen. I Charles Cutler of the State of North Carolina and County of Hyde Being infirm in Body but in sound memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in the following manner and form that is to say I Give & Recommend my soul into the hands into the hands of Almighty God who gave it & my Body I recommend to the Earth to be decently interred at the discretion of my Executors and touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I will and Bequeath in the following form. I Give and Bequeath to my eldest son Joseph Cutler one hundred acres of land lying on the north side of the Lake being the Land known by the name

Item I Give & Bequeath to my Daughter Silence Cutler my Bed and furniture & one looking glass

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Andrew Cutler ten pounds in money to pay for schooling which is my Desire he should have. It is my will and desire that all the remaining part of my property goods and chattels that are not already given here or disposed of shall be Equally divided amongst seven of my Children viz Charles, Stephen, Jr., John, Francis, Silence & Andrew Cutler. — On Lastly I do constitute appoint & ordain my eldest son Joseph Cutler and Andrew Cutler whole & sole Executors of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow Revoke and Disannul all and every other will and Testament by me in anywise formerly made. Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament In witness where of I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal this 11th day of March in the 17th year of our Lord 1795.
