

State of North Carolina, Jan 17th 1795, Judith Swindell
 Hyde County bring in a Last will & Testament but
 in my proper sense and under oaths laid to make this my
 Last will and Testament. First I commit my soul and all
 the rest of my family into the hands of God next in order
 I give and bequeath one hundred acres of land lying on the
 west side of Long Sholes river to my son Wade Swindell and
 I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Swindell fifty acres of
 Land in the same Part and Dijin and Bequeath to my son
 Valentine Swindell the Land whereon I now live reckoned
 and twenty five acres more and I give and bequeath to my Daughter
 Thaughier one acre and Shilling, I give and bequeath to my son
 Parker Swindell his his one Shilling, I give and bequeath to
 Daughter Margaret one Shilling bed and such furniture
 as belongs to it, and I give and bequeath to my wife Abby
 Swindell all the rest of my estate during her life or
 widowhood and then to be equally divided between all my
 Children now living.

I leave my wife and son Jacob Swindell my executors to
 this my Last will and Testament.

 life do make & declare this my last will and Testament

 all, I recommend my soul to almighty God and my body to the
 earth to be decently Buried at the discretion of my executors
 hereafter mentioned and as touching such worthy goods as it
 hath pleased God to bestow on me I dispose of in form following
 to say first my will is that one hundred acres of Land lying
 between first & last Grand branches of the river back from
 the river side to make one hundred acres be sold by my
 executors for the purpose of settling my debts and the support of my
 beloved wife James Hammorn & her three children
 namely Abbie, James & Margaret Hammorn —

Item I bind myself to my beloved wife James Hammorn for and during
 her natural life all my Estate Personal and Real —
 Item I give & bequeath unto my dear daughter Abby and Hammorn
 one acre and Dijin —

and my will is that at the death of my beloved wife James Hammorn
 whole Estate Equally divided amongst my three beloved children
 namely Abbie Hammorn James Hammorn & Margaret Hammorn —
 I Constitute and appoint my beloved wife James Hammorn and my
 beloved Brother John Basal Hammorn executors to this my last
 will and Testament and Testimoniales whereof I have caused to set
 my hand and seal this day & date above written
 Signed Sealed & Dated —
