In the Name of God Amen. I Andrew Kithpatrick of the County of Iredell in the State of N Carolina being in perfect mind & memory yet calling to mind the mortality of my body Do make & ordain in this my last will & testament. That I principally Recommend my Soul to almighty God who govt my body to the earth to be buried in decent christian buriall at the discretion of my Executors. And as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to endow me with I give devise & bequeath in the following manner.

First after all my lawful debts are paid discharged I give & bequeath to my daughters Ephecia Kithpatrick & Mary McTear to each a bible as a remembrance they having their part formerly.
Also to my daughter Pamela Kithpatrick I give & bequeath a negro girl named Dorcas but if in Case my negro girl should die or become an invalid then in that case she must tarry with my wife during her life or as long as my ^{Wife} desired then govt into her possession also her bed & furniture & as much dress or furniture as my other daughters got. Also I give & bequeath to my son Joseph Kithpatrick the plantation which I bought Robert Long agreeable to the Bath & Bound.
Also to my son Joshua Kithpatrick I give & bequeath my negro Boy named Miles. Also to my sons William & J. P. I give & bequeath ^{the largest share} which I bought from Robert Gordon containing 14/2 acres allowing to J. P. two thirds of the whole & to William one third of the whole. I also give & bequeath to my son Andrew C. Kithpatrick one hundred & ten acres of Land on the east end of the plantation on which I now live to be

which I now live on my South line.
I also give & bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Kilpatrick during
her widowhood the remainder of that tract of Land on which
I now live with all the improvements with my Negroes & Stock
of every kind farming utensils house hold furniture & every other
appurtenance except the Negroes, Stock & Furniture before mentioned
But in case my Widow should marry again I should give & be-
queath to my son Alexander M. Kilpatrick the plantation which is
to her with its houses & buildings only she shall then have one Negro
girl named Mimi with her bed & furniture during life & then
return to the estate. And whether at her death or her marriage
the remaining part of the property is to be divided between my
two sons. And^{to} C. V. Alexander the Negro Part of it, & the rem-
ainder part of between the same two And^{to} C. V. Alexander M. My
daughter Pamela. Also it is my will that my wife Elizabeth
shall have ~~her~~ ^{that} portion that her father left her by his last will
& Testament. And lastly, I do ^{hereby} constitute & appoint ordain my
Brother Jas. M. Corkle & my son Joseph A. Kilpatrick to be
the Executors of this my last will & Testament & I do hereby
disallow revoke & disannul all former Wills legacies & bequests
whatsoever heretofore made or mentioned ratifying & confirming
this & no other to be my last will & Testament Witness my hand
& Seal this 16th day of June 1810
