friend James Steel Executor of this my last will & Testament in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this Eighteenth day of May
One thousand eight Hundred & Eleven. 1811

memory & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die
do make & ordain this my last will & Testament. That is to say

created it & my body to be buried in decency at the discretion of my

Executors, I wishing such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to
Endow me with I give & bequeath the same in the way & manner
following: Viz. First I give & bequeath to my two Sons David &
Thomas Beggartley the sum of five shillings each also to my daughters
Elenor Lazenby, Nancy Fitzgerald & Elizabeth Reid, I give & bequeath the
sum of five shillings each & no more. To my beloved wife Elizabeth Beggartley
I give & bequeath all the residue of my Estate both real & personal for her proper
use & Benefit during her natural life. & at the decease of my said wife I do by this
my said will give & bequeath unto my son Charles Beggartley all the aforesaid
residue of my Estate, as well, all my personal property both goods & chattles,
with the increase as all the lands & Tenements of which I may be possessed at
my death for his own proper use & Benefit forever —

And I do hereby constitute & appoint my said wife Elizabeth
& my said son Charles Beggartley to execute this my last will &
Testament. I do by these presence utterly disallow all former wills
Legacies & bequests, by me heretofore made or named Ratifying & confirming
this & no other to be my last will & Testament.
