full sum of ten Shillings. Thirdly. I give & bequeath  
to my beloved daughter Polly Cummons (alias) Criswell  
or her representatives the full sum of ten Shillings  
Fourthly. I give & bequeath unto my beloved son David Criswell  
or his representatives the full sum of ten Shillings.  
Fifthly. I give & bequeath to my well beloved daughters  
Martha Armstrong (alias) Criswell, Margaret Criswell  
& Sarah Criswell all the residuary part of my estate &c.

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to be equally divided amongst them, share & share alike  
And I hereby make & ordain my worthy daughter <sup>Martha</sup> ~~Margaret~~  
& Sarah Criswells Executors of this my last will & testament  
in witness whereof I the said Margaret Criswell have to  
this my last will & Testament, set my hand & seal the  
day & year above written
