In the name of God Amen I John  
McLean of the State of Carolina & County of Pickens,  
Being of sound & perfect mind & memory, (blessed be God)  
do this thirty first day of March in the Year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred & <sup>1817</sup>seventeen, make & publish  
this my last will & testament, in the following manner  
That is to say, First I give & bequeath to my loving wife her  
living & support of the plantation whereon I now live  
during her natural lifetime—  
2<sup>nd</sup>ly I give & bequeath to my well beloved son Henry  
L. McLean all my lands & improvements to me in  
any wise belonging at this time, together with a  
mare to me belonging. 3<sup>rd</sup>ly I give & bequeath to  
my beloved son John McLean ten shillings to be  
paid by my executor when he shall have collec-  
ted my debts. Fourthly in like manner I give &  
bequeath to my beloved Daughter Sarah Smith ten  
Shillings. Fifthly, I give & bequeath to my loving

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Son Joseph MLean ten Shillings—

Sixthly, I give & bequeath to my daughter Elsa Smith 10 <sup>Shillings</sup>  
7<sup>th</sup>ly I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Patterson 10 Shillings  
8<sup>th</sup>ly I give to my daughter May Campbell ten Shillings.  
9<sup>th</sup>ly I give to my daughter Susanna Shoemaker ten Shillings.

All of which money shall be paid to the above named persons by my Executor when he shall have collected enough so to do out of ~~my~~ moneys to me due in this County. And I hereby nominate & appoint & ordain my beloved Son Henry L MLean Executor of this my last will & Testament In witness whereof the said John MLean have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal day & date first above written, Signed sealed & delivered by the said John MLean as his last will & Testament, in the presence of us who were present at the time of signing & sealing thereof
