land I now live on he lefting two Notes one due to Allen Alexander
and the to Wharriors Estate this present spoken of Land to be paid
off along my son Williams with time and I will and allow my
son Isaac to make him a deed of conveyance for the same at any
time he calls for it secondly I will and allow the other two hundred
Acres of Land to my son Isaac Witherspoons for him to sup
port himself and his mother while she lives when the Land comes
to be sold Alexander and Isaac is to pay James and Betsey
each of them twenty dollars they are each of them to pay
according to the quantity of Land they hold and Isaac is to give
his mother a horse and saddle out of his part Thirdly I will and
bequeath to my beloved wife all the house hold furniture and the
half of the stock and as for Leggy I allow her mare and
Saddle and two cows and what other things she has in the House I also
will and allow Isaac all the farming utensils belonging to the
plantation I do in this my last will otherwise Isaac to make a
deed of conveyance for a part or the whole of the Land as need
require & 3 in the fifth place all unpaid debts to be paid

11th 1801
