I Thomas Gray of Truitt County & State of North Carolina,  
being in a very feeble condition of body, but of perfect mind & memory do  
make this my last will & testament in manner as followeth Viz.  
First of all I <sup>do</sup> commit ~~mine~~ my soul to God who gave it & my body to  
the dust, to be buried in a decent & Christian manner as becometh  
Christianity. And as touching my small estate which it has pleased  
God to enrich me with I do dispose of in manner as follow.  
Item I do will & bequeath to my loving wife Polly Gray, the one third  
of all my personal property, during her life, & at her disposal at  
her death with her living off my lands & the dwelling House I  
now live in with my negre girl Iris for her life time.  
I do will that such a part of my personal property as is needful  
to be sold to pay of all Just debts. Item I do will & bequeath unto my  
beloved son John Gray, one hundred acres of the land I now live on  
on the south side. Item I do will & bequeath to my beloved son James  
Gray, one hundred acres of the <sup>same</sup> ~~same~~ <sup>part</sup> being at the north east corner  
& running to the best advantage for land & water.

will in to lay it of so as it may average with I not injure the remaining  
part, to be laid of when he is of age, or at his mothers death.

Item I do will & bequeath to my beloved son Thomas Gray, all the  
remainder of this plantation after the former Disposition is made with  
the dwelling Houes at his mothers Death. Also, as to my lands which lye  
in the state of Tennessee. I dispose of it in the following manner i.e.  
my son Geo. shall choose two men in that State, I divide off four  
Hundred Acres more or less to the best advantage in quality of water.  
One for himself & one for each of my other three sons, & the remainder  
part of the disposed of at the best advantage for the support of the family,  
also he shall have power to dispose of any of the other parts at any  
time before they come of age (each of them casting lots for their share)  
And the money arising for the same to be given for the use of  
them to whom the share belongs. Also I do will, that my negro  
man Dave be employd in the support of the family. Also my negro  
woman Lris, I do will to be divided, with her issue at the death  
of my wife among my beloved daughters Ellen, Polly, Jane, Betty  
& Peggy. Also the rest of my property not before disposed of, to be for  
the support of the family, & if there is any thing to spare each as  
they marry or come of age may have a divide. I am account  
kept thereof to settle the same with them at the last. also all the  
estate personal to be equally divided among all my children  
when the youngest comes of age or at their mothers death in case  
she should not survive untill they are all of age. Only Scott's

Family Bible I leave for the equal use of all my family, & no one may  
may take or dispose of the same unless in case of removal distant  
from the rest they may sell their part to the others.
