## In the name of God Amen

I William Davidson of the County of Iredell in the State of North Carolina being sick and in a low condition but thanks be to God am in sound mind & memory therefore calling to remembrance the mortallity of the Body doth this twentyfifth day of April in the year of Our Lord 1803 make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament And first I recommend my Soul to God who gave it me & my Body I commend to the dust there to be buried in a Christian & decent manner at the discretion of my Executors. And as touching such mortally estate as I am possessed of I leave & bequeath as followeth. I first of all I allow so much of my personal property to be sold as may be sufficient to pay my just debts the property to be such as my Executors may think can be best spared out of my estate Unto my beloved wife Polly I leave a good Horse Saddle & bridle two beds with their furniture & that of the Kitchen & Cup board furniture three cows & three calves six head of sheep & her choice of my three Negro women to provide that her Choice be made within three months after my Decease. I also allow unto her a good & decent maintenance of my plantation I now live on during her natural life or widowhood. In case she should marry again she is to be entitled to her right of Power only Unto my two Daughters Emilia & Rachel I leave to each of them (if the circumstances of my estate will admit therof) as much as either of my married daughters has got, at the discretion of my their mother & my Executors. Unto my sons Willie Davidson son John Davidson, Abner Davidson, Ephraim Davidson & Samuel Davidson I leave each a horse Saddle & bridle if the circumstance of my estate will admit therof a ~~and~~ <sup>and</sup> each of them arrives at the age of twenty one years & my land & all to be divided equally among each of them to the best advantage in quantity & quality. If one or either of my sons should before turn or shall be come capable of taking care

 I further allow the residue of my property (after my just debts are paid) to be  
 kept in my family for their better maintenance & supports until my eldest  
 child becomes capable of inheriting at which time I allow the Residue of  
 Property to be disposed of to the best advantage at the discretion of my executors  
 Who shall equally divide amongst my then surviving children I  
 lastly I constitute & appoint my brother Ephraim Davidson & Jas' Her the  
 Executors of this my last Will & Testament Signed Seal'd & acknowledged on present

 apparel & books I likewise order that what remains of my estate after the above legacies  
 I pay off shall under the care & direction of my dear wife for her support during  
 her life time that it shall be in her power & at her direction with the concord of  
 my other executors to sell & dispose of any part of my personal estate for her support  
 & advantage Item I order that at my dear wifes decease what remains of my estate  
 shall be disposed of in the following manner (1) the part of my old navy estate  
 I order to become the property of Frederick Davidson
