of the Honey, I also give & bequeath to my well beloved
Wife her own Suttle & all the Household Furniture
properly belonging to me, I likewise give & bequeath
to my beloved Wife the Dwelling House during her
lifetime & order that she shall have a part of the
benefits of the Church, & I will that she shall
have my Loom &ack lings, & then I will & bequeath
to my Son James Edmund the Note the
same on himself, And I likewise will & order that
my Son John Edmund shall have to my Son Robt.
Edmund fifty Dollars, And I likewise order that my
Son Samuel Edmund shall have to my Son Robert
Edmund fifty Dollars, I also give & bequeath to my
Son John Edmund & Samuel Edmund my Plantation
and shall divide to each of them, I also give and
bequeath to my Grand Son John Edmund and to my
Grand Son Burtis Dollars, I also give & bequeath
to my Grand Son John Gibson thirty Dollars,
I also give & bequeath to my Grand Son James Edmund
to my Son John Edmunds Son Twenty Dollars
I also give & bequeath to my Grand Daughter Peggy
Edmund that is Samuel Edmunds Daughter Twenty
Dollars, Then I will order that my well beloved
Wife shall have a sufficient Suttle of the benefits
of the Plantation for a comfortable living during her
lifetime & I likewise order that she shall have a
Bushel of Flaxseed sowed for her yearly

my Sons John Edmond & Samuel Edmond shal

I constitute & appoint my Son John Edmond and
William Gibson my Son in Law, Executors of this

acres in land. I think I give and bequeath
to my Son John Edmond & Samuel Edmond

In the name of God Amen I John Edmund of Fredricks County State of North Carolina being of sound mind & memory & calling to mind my mortality do make & ordain this my last will & testament in the following manner (Viz) I give & bequeath to my well beloved wife Rebecca one hundred dollar & my negr woman Call & three cows & like wise my sheep a greable to the divide made & I order that those stock shall be split free on the st Likewise order that she shall have two good Hogs yearly during her life time, I likewise order that she shall have the third part of the honey, I also give & bequeath to my well beloved wife her own saddle & all the house hold ~~property~~ ^{property} belonging to me I likewise give & bequeath to my beloved wife the dwelling house During her life time, I order that she shall have a part of the benefits of the orchard & I will that she shall have my worn blackings, then I give & bequeath & devise to my son James Edmund the note that I have on himself & likewise will & order that my son John Edmund shall pay to my son Robt. Edmund fifty Dollars & I likewise order that my son Samuel Edmund shall pay to my son Robt. Edmund fifty Dollars, I also give & bequeath to my son John Edmund & Samuel Edmund my plantation an equal divide to each of them, I also give & bequeath to my grand son John Edmund that is Robt. Edmunds son twenty dollar, I also give & bequeath to my grand son John Gibson twenty Dollars, I also give & bequeath to my grand son James Edmund that is my son John Edmunds son twenty dollar, I also give & bequeath to my granddaughter Peggy Edmund that is Samuel Edmunds daughter twenty Dollars, then I will & order that my well beloved wife shall have a sufficient support of the benefits of the plantation for comfortable living During her lifetime & likewise order that she shall have a half a bushel of peas seed sowed for her yearly During her lifetime, & likewise will & order that my son John Edmund & Samuel Edmunds shall have the balance of the money remaining. I constitute & appoint my son John Edmund & Wm Gibson my son in law Executors of this my last will & testament given under my hand & seal this 27 day of June 1807 Signed sealed & published in presence of us
