my mortality do hereby order and dispose of in the
manner following. My I give will and bequeath
to my son Wm McConnel my Gray Mare and two of
his choice of Cows the bread that he ^{sleeps} pleases on it is to be
filled up with good Fodder until it is considered a good
bead a good Boulster and two of the best pillows in the
house four Chests and as many other bead clothing
as is sufficient for a good bead, my old Trunk and all
my Dresser and Kitchen furniture all the mixed
cotton cloth I have on hand two short patrons

I give unto my son Wm. Smith one hundred
dolls of fine cotton cloth & one hundred yards of woolen cloth.

I also give and bequeath unto my son Wm. Smith one hundred
dollars in cash. Secondly, I give bequeath to my Grandson
Alexander Allison Smith two hundred dollars in cash.

I will and devise unto my Grand Daughter Margaret
Smith my other Bed and cloathing linen and tra-
velings one hundred and ten dollars in cash. I will
and devise unto my Grand Daughter Catherine Ch-
~~stening~~ ~~Smith~~ ~~Smith~~ one hundred and ten dollars each.

The ballance of my Estate to be sold at publick sale
and after paying my just debts to be equally divided
to my son Wm. Allison and Grand Children as above
mentioned. Except my wearing clothes which are to be
equally divided between my Grand Children and
less as above mentioned. I hereby appoint my truly
