

Will of William Hocut

In the name of God Amen I William Hocut of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being in perfect mind and memory thankes be to God for the same wherefore calling to mind the mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed once for all to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all to give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner and form at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the power of Almighty God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

I will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of my estate.

I bequeath to my loving wife Saffia the plantation and house with all reasonable privileges for the use of the same during her natural life also a child's part of all the rest of my estate to be disposed of at her will.

I devise to my loving son William Brown Hocut the land and plantation whereon I now live containing three hundred and twenty six acres be the same more or less also any equal part of the rest of my estate to him and his heirs forever.

It is my will that all my estate not already mentioned be equally divided between Sarah Hocut Elizabeth Hocut and Mary Miles Hocut to be divided without selling the same under the direction of my executors and I hereby make my worthy friend Benjamin Hill and my wife executors and trustees of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I the said William Hocut have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal this 27 day of May one thousand seven hundred and nine. Dighted sealed and delivered by the said
