

Will of Burnet Jones.

In the name of God Amen. This ninth day of October A.D. 1821
 I Burnet Jones of North Carolina in the County of Johnston
 Gentlemen being very much afflicted in body but of perfect
 mind and memory (thanks be given to God) therefore calling unto
 mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is
 appointed once for all men to die do make and ordain this
 my last will and testament, That is to say principally and
 first of all to give and recommend my soul unto the hands
 of God that gave it and my body to the earth
 To be buried in a decent Christian manner and at the ex-
 ecution of my friends nothing doubting but at general resurrection
 I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God
 And as touching such worldly estate where with it hath pleased
 God to bless me with in this life, I give and dispose of
 in the manner and form as follows,

I give Bequeath to Tempy my dearly beloved wife after my just debts are paid the money I have in hand also all debts Item
 that are due by note or account with all the rest of my practicable property whi: my horse my cattle hogs sheep crop and plantation tools withall my household and kitchen furniture to have and to hold the same and freely possess and enjoy during her lifetime or widowhood, but if my wife Tempy should think proper to again then the above mentioned property to go to my two children Item
 Lucy Jones, Wiley Jones all & singularly every thing except one bed and furniture and one cow and calf which I freely give to her forever to possess I also do appoint her to be my sole and sole Item
 executor to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal the day and date above written

Will of Abel Johnson

State of North Carolina.

Johnston County I In the name of God Amen, The ninth day of February anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and seventeen Abel Johnson of the County and State aforesaid being sick of body but of sound and perfect memory thanks be to Almighty God and calling to mind the uncertain estate of this mortal life and that all flesh was made once to die I do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner following, first I recommend my soul to Almighty God that made it and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned and for the settlement of my temporal estate and such goods and chattles as it hath pleased God to bestow on me I do order give and dispose the same in manner and form following,

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son Amos Johnston one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Nancy Johnson one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Elizabeth Johnson one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Edith Johnson one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son Jonathan Johnson twenty shillings to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son Henry Johnson twenty shilling to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved Samuel Johnson twenty shillings to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Sally Dufree twenty shillings to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Ann Johnson the land and plantation wherein I now live and all the plantation tools and crop of all kind and all household furniture all my horses and cattle hogs and stock of all kinds also the notes and

judgement to due me and cash in hand I leave for my debts to be settled out of and the balance I give to my wife also during her natural life and after her decease I leave the land and premises and all the goods and chattles that I give to my wife to be equally divided between my three youngest daughters Henry Johnson, Elizabeth Johnson and Edith Johnson to them and their heirs forever.

I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my sons Jonathan Johnson and Henry Johnson full and sole executors of this my last will and testament hereby disannulling and making void all other or former wills and testaments by me made this only being my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal

Will of Hannah H. Lockhart.

In the name of God Amen, I Hannah H. Lockhart of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina, being in full health of body but a and of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form—

First I leave my negro girl Alice to be sold and the money so be divided between Patsy Mitchens and Edith Tomlinson any wearing apparel to be divided between said Patsy Mitchens and Edith Tomlinson.

I give my son Thomas Lockhart one dollar and all the rest of my property I leave to be sold and the money so be equally divided between all my children except the said Thomas Lockhart, but I want his four children to have and equal share with one of my own children.

I leave Samuel Mitchens and Harris Tomlinson any sole executors to this my last will and testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannull all and other former testaments wills legacies bequests and executors by me in anywise before named willed and bequeathed and ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16th day October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventeen.
