

Will of Alexander Hobby

For the name of God Amen, I Alexander Hobby Jr of Johnston County and State of North Carolina planter being in a low state of health of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God for that and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give demise and dispose of the same in following manner and form.

Item First I lend after my just debts being paid to Sarah Hobby my dearly beloved wife the land and plantation I am now possessed with as so much as she may have occasion for me all my stock of every kind household furniture plantation tools and every thing I possessed which is not other ways disposed of hereafter to be by her enjoyed during her natural life and after her death should there be any remainder to be sold by my executors and disposed of as is here decided.

Item I give and bequeath after my wifes death unto my well beloved son William Hobby five shillings.

Item I give and bequeath after my wifes decease unto my well beloved son Alexander Hobby five shillings.

Item I give and bequeath after my wifes decease unto my well beloved son Henry Hobby five shillings

Item I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Elizabeth Hobby one feather bed and furniture my horn and all harness

Item I give and bequeath after my wifes decease unto my well beloved son Johnathan Hobby five shillings.

Item I give and bequeath after my wifes decease unto my well beloved daughter Sally Wilson five shillings

I give and bequeath after my wifes decease unto my well beloved son Francis Hobby the land and plantation all but what I have already deeded away with all appertinence thereto belonging that I have a deed from John Morris for

Item I give and bequeath after my wifes decease unto my well beloved son Brister Hobby the land and plantation wherein I now live with all appertinences thereto belonging and after my wifes decease if there is any thing remaining to be sold by executors and the money one third to be equally divided between Alexander Hobby, Henry Hobby and Johnathan Hobby the other two third to be divided amongst Elizabeth Hobby, Sally Wilson, Frances Hobby and Brister Hobby and I do hereby constitute and appoint Alexander Hobby Jr and David Bell executors to this my last will and testament satisfying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty ninth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and three. Signed sealed published pronounced and declared by the said Alexander Hobby to be his last will and testament and in presence of each have hereunto subscribed our names
