

Will of Alexander Sanders

Alexander Sanders of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory do make and declare this paper writing to be my last will and testament in manner and form following.

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Phoebe Sanders the tract of land upon which I now live during her natural life one cow and calf & yearling her choice, one sow and twenty three pigs one horse called Felix and harness all my household and kitchen furniture and all the holly.

I give unto my daughter Rebecca Byrd wife of Thomas Byrd one hundred dollars in money.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Sanders one hundred dollars in money.

I give to my son Ashley Sanders my brandy still & fixtures which is now on the land I gave him.

I give and bequeath to my step son Macon Johnson the part whereon I now live after the death of my said wife Phoebe Sanders provided he pays over to my executor herein after named two hundred and fifty dollars as early as practicable and remains here taking care of me and his mother our life time.

I hereby constitute and appoint my truly friend Wm H. Sanders my lawful executor to execute this my last will and testament by first paying all my just debts & collecting whatever may be due my estate & by paying the legacies bequeathed above made.

My will further is that the residue of my estate if any be divided between Rebecca Byrd, Leary Sanders, Jordan Sanders & Ashley Sanders and that the crop or provisions on hand at the time of my death be given entirely to my wife and Macon Johnson.

And I Alexander Sanders do hereby revoke and declare utterly void all other wills by me heretofore made
