I leave to my wife until my children comes of age and then I give to my son Gray one negro girl Phillis I give my son James one negro boy Tom I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy one negro boy Warren and do constitute and appoint my beloved wife executrix and my beloved friend Sherrad Woodin executor of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 24th day of November 1813
