Will of Anna O Neal

In the name of God Amen I Anna O Neal of the County of Johnston
and State of North Carolina Do this 17th day of August 1829 make
and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form
following first give and bequeath to my son Stephen O Neal four
negros by the name of Lewis, Brunsill, Charity and Mary to him
and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Stephen O Neal all my household
and kitchen furniture of every kind and all my stock of every kind
consisting of horses hogs and cattle and all my working tools of every
kind also two hundred and ninety acres of land in said town
and adjoining the lands of Josiah Holloman and others for him
and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Micajah O Neal fifty dollars in money for him
and his heirs forever.

Item I give to Ally Bailey seventy-five dollars for she and her heirs
forever.

Item I put in the hands of Stephen O Neal and Benjamin Hocut my exec-
utors to this to will five negroes by the name of Annisha, Gatz, Zilla
Tennet and Henry to be sold at credit of six months and when
sold my executors pay the amount of said bonds into the hands
of the guardian of Lucyey Hocut, Henry Hocut and Willie Hocut
orphans of William B. Hocut deceased which sum my daughter Lucyey
Earp owes to the above orphans to the amount of four hundred &
fifty dollars.

Item My will is that if the said negroes ever pay the sum of four
hundred and fifty dollars which my daughter owes to said orphans
then the residue of said money to be equally divided between
Lucrey Hocut, Henry Hocut & Willie Hocut orphans of William
B. Hocut deceased.

I appoint my beloved son Stephen O Neal and Benjamin Hocut
executors to this my last will and testament in witness whereof
I do hereunto set my hand and seal this day and date above

Will of William Wall

In the name of God Amen I William Wall of Johnston County
in the state of North Carolina through the mercy of God
though weak in body yet of a sound and perfect mind and
memory thanks be to God do constitute this instrument of writing
to be and contain my last will and testament in the manner
following (viz) I lend to my loving wife Betza Wall during her
life or widowhood all my lands including my dwelling house
wherein I now live and after selling as much of the property as will
pay my just debts I also lend the use of my property to my
wife Betza during her life or widowhood and also I give to my
wife Betza all the corn meat & bread that I have at my decease and
after the decease or marriage of my wife Betza I give and bequeath
to my son William John Bogdon Wall all my lands including my
dwelling house containing two hundred and seventeen acres and if
my son Wm J.B. Wall should decease without and heir I want the
land sold and the money divided between my two sons and four
daughters (to wit) Jonathan Thomas Wall, Garrett Banks Wall, Lydia
Creach, Lucinda Barnell Betza B. Wall, Mary Ann Wall. I give
to Jonathan T. Wall one horse one bed and furniture one cow and pigs
one washing tub one pigsty one sitting chair one half dozen earthen
plates which property he has received I also give to Jonathan
T. Wall fifty dollars to pay for land which he has received
twenty five dollars I give to Lydia Creach one cow one bed and
furniture one chest one pot one pan half dozen earthen plates
and one salt of cups and saucers one sitting chair which property
she has received I give to my son James P.B. Wall one horse one
feather bed and furniture one sitting chair one washing tub and
one pair and fifty dollars in money to pay for land which he
has received I give to my daughter Lucinda Barnold one cow &
calf one feather bed and furniture one chest one half dozen earthen
plates one salt-cups and saucers which she has received
My will is that William J.B. Wall and Betza B. Wall and Mary
Ann Wall have and equal share with those that have married
off except the land and money that is given to my land my will
is that William J.B. Wall have my shot gun and watch extra &
if my wife Mary I want her to have equal portion with my
children and I do constitute appoint my wife Betza Wall and
Josiah Shoulders executors of this my last will and testament
in witness whereof I set my hand and seal this 8th day of
January in the year of our Lord 1834. Signed sealed and pub-
lished by the said Wm Wall to be his last will and testament in the
present of
