Will of Arnold Pugh

In the name of God Amen, I Arnold Pugh of the State
of North Carolina and County of Johnston being in a sound
state of health but in perfect mind and memory blessed
be God to this 24th day of February in the year of
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three do
make and publish this my last will and testament in man-
ner following.

I give and bequeath unto Milby Kent the daughter of
Milby Kent wife of Wiley Kent two hundred acres of
land including the plantation whereon I now live to her and
her heirs forever

Also two cows and one yearling one sow and six pigs six
year old hogs one wooden wheel one dutch oven one washing
tub one earthen dish two pewter plates two earthen bowls
one pewter cup five pewter spoon one sitting chair one flatt-
er bedstead and furniture one cutting axe two bee hives
six hundred wt. of bacon one hand saw one drawing knife
two augers one chisel one meal stand one side of leather one
gourd and fat to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto Mary Kent daughter of Milby
Kent as aforesaid two hundred acres of land adjoining my
plantation enclosed in the same patent one black horse

and six pigs one sow and three pigs ten barrels of corn two
bee hives one cutting axe one pot one spider one skillet one
water pail three pewter plates one earthen bowl one coffee
pot one bedstead and furniture one chest one gridiron
one pair of sheep shears one sitting chair and one case of
knives and forks one hand mill one side of leather one
grind stone one cart and wheels to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto Nathan Crumpler three
hundred acres of land lying on the south side of great
Quadrina Creek bounded on the north side by said creek on the
east by William Pugh land on the west by Thomas Eatmans
land to him and his heirs forever.

All the rest and residue of my property I leave to be
sold and the money arising therefrom to be appropriated to
the payment of my debts and if any remaining to be
equally divided between Datince Stickland, Penelope Johnston

and ~~Arnold~~ Pugh and Abel Pugh to belong to them and their heirs forever
 And I do hereby nominate and appoint my ^{and wife} ~~truly~~ ^{and wife} friends Hardy Reinhardt and William Wentzow executors to this my last will and testament.

I do lend unto my beloved wife during her natural life or widowhood both land and personal property and if she my beloved wife should die or marry before my son Abner comes of age it is my desire that my negro should be hired out and the other property be sold and the money equally divided between my six children Reinhardt, Anna, Abner, Polly, Willey and Gadock also my lands to be rented and the profits thereof divided in the same manner as the moneys of my other property among my other children

I do hereby revoke and make void all other wills heretofore and acknowledge this to be my last will and desire.

I also do appoint and constitute Jonah Holder my executor to execute this my last will and testament
