State of North Carolina Johnston County this the 8<sup>th</sup> day of October  
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty six  
I Caleb Ballard of the State and County above written  
being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my  
last will and testament - to wit -

Item 1<sup>st</sup> Give and bequeath unto my beloved grand son James C. Ballard  
one dollar I also give unto my grand son Roday Ballard  
one dollar I also give and bequeath unto Ashley C. Ballard  
one dollar.

Item 2 I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Mary  
Ballard the tract of land where I now live containing  
one hundred and fifty two acres more or less also all  
my bridle and saddle also all my hogs & cattle  
also all my working tools of all kinds also all my  
household and kitchen furniture.

I leave my worthy daughter Mary Ballard my executors  
to this my last will and testament.

Will of Molly Wall

In the name of God Amen I Molly Wall of the County of  
Johnston being of sound and perfect mind and memory  
blessed be God do this the 28<sup>th</sup> day of December in the year  
of our Lord 1849 make and publish this my last will  
and testament - in manner following that is to say

First I give and bequeath unto my daughter Phoebe Murphy all  
my wearing apparel and one half of my greater ware.

Second I give and bequeath unto Abie my son Perry Walls widow during  
her lifetime all of my property not heretofore devised consisting of  
household and kitchen furniture also what part or interest I may  
have in any deceased husbands land & premises or anything thereto  
attached by way of husbandry &c.

Thirdly It is my desire that the property given to my son Perry Walls  
widow at her death be equally divided amongst her children namely  
John R., Mary W., Dennis, ~~and~~, Sarah P., & John B. Wall.  
And I hereby appoint make and ordain my grand son John B. Wall  
executor of this my last will and testament - in witness whereof  
I the said Molly Wall have to this my last will and testament  
set my hand and seal the day and year above written
