I Benjamin Hocutt of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say.

First - That my executor hereinafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives & friends and pay all funeral expenses together with all my just debts howsoever and to whomsoever owing out of the money that first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item 1 I give and devise to my beloved wife Smitha Hocutt my home plantation containing four hundred and sixty one acres during her lifetime then I give the said four hundred and sixty one acres to be equally divided at my wife's death between my six children to wit - Nancy Holliland, that married William Holliland and William Hocutt and Rilda Ligons deceased that married Henry Ligons to her bodily heirs and Lany Hocutt a single woman and Atlas Hocutt and James Hocutt sons & daughters to them and their heirs forever and in the division of this tract of land above named I want my son James to have the house lot.

Item 2 My plantation lying on Little River in said county containing two hundred and fifty five acres adjoining Zachariah Hocutt and Josiah Puller and others at the west end of said tract of land I want forty acres adjoining Josiah Puller & Zachariah Hocutt off and sold by my executor.

Item 3 I give to my son Carroll Hocutt seventy one acres adjoining the said forty acres and adjoining his other land running this seventy one acres north and south to him and his heirs forever.
